- 1513 Juan Ponce de Leon discovers Florida.
- 1763 Spain trades Florida to the Kingdom of Great Britian
- 1814 First Seminole War begins.
- 1818 Andrew Jackson captures Indian traders/Creek agitators at the Suwanee River, trying, convicting, and carrying out death sentences.
- 1819 Florida is purchased from Spain for \$5.0 million (debt forgiven) Adams/Onis Treaty.
- 1819 First Seminole War ends.
- 1835 Second Seminole War begins.
- 1838 Seminole Chief Osceola, imprisoned at Ft Moultrie, SC, is painted by renowned portrait artist George Caitlin.
- 1839 Harney Point Massacre. Seminole Indians attack trading post killing 13 of Col. Wm. S. Harney's soldiers.
- 1840 Dr. Perrine, a botanist who is the developer of the Perrine lemon, is murdered, along with his family, by an Indian war party, at Indian Key.
- 1841 Hurricane destroys Fort Delaney (October 1841).
- 1842 Second Seminole War ends.
- 1845 Florida becomes the 27th state of the United States of America.
- 1847 Thomas Edison is born in Milan, Ohio, on February 11, 1847.
- 1850 Fort Harvie, a military fort, is constructed. Later renamed Fort Myers.
- 1855 Third Seminole War begins.
- 1857 The last stand of the Seminoles against the US, at Welch's Grove in present Collier Count, per WSH.
- 1858 Chief Billie Bowlegs surrenders and the fort (Fort Myers) is abandoned.
- 1858 Third Seminole War ends.
- 1859 Manuel A Gonzalez, born in Spain, becomes a naturalized citizen in Monroe Co., Fla.
- 1861 US Civil War begins.
- 1861 Major James Evans, then living in Southwest Fla., plants coconut trees near the river in what would become the city of Ft Myers.
- 1861 In April, the Confederate Congress begins printing its first paper money, which honors then-capital, Montgomery, Alabama.
- 1863 Union army troops reoccupy Fort Myers (December 1863)
- 1865 Fort Myers is attacked by three companies of the Florida militia (February 25,1865).
- 1865 US Civil War ends.
- 1866 Manuel A Gonzalez arrives in Fort Myers, becoming it's first settler.
- 1873 Punta Rassa destroyed by 110 mph wids and 14' storm surge.
- 1880 Edison is granted patent for electric lamp.
- 1881 Hamilton Disston purchases 4.0 million acres of Florida and dredging begins south of Lake Okeechobee.
- 1883 W. Stanley Hanson is born in Key West during November.
- 1884 Dr William Hanson and family arrive in Fort Myers.
- 1884 Mary Stilwell Edison, Thomas Edison's first wife, dies of "congestion of the brain."
- 1885 Thomas Edison and Ezzra Gilliland discover Ft. Myers. TAE pays \$2,750 for 13-acre riverfront site.
- 1886 City of Fort Myers is incorporated. Second largest city on Florida's west coast.
- 1886 In May, Frank Stout and family arrive in Ft Myers from Michigan to run the Press.
- 1887 Construction is completed on the Seminole Lodge, laboratory and Gilliland residence.
- 1887 Lee County is created by act of the legislature. Formerly part of Monroe County.
- 1888 Harvie E. Heitman, 16-years old, arrives in Ft. Myers and later enters business with his uncle, Howell A. Parker.
- 1888 Henry Flagler opens Ponce de Leon Hotel in St. Augustine, on January 10, 1888.
- 1888 Mrs. Hanson, Mrs. Parker, Mrs. Stout and others canvass for the Nickel Club to raise money for worthy civic projects in Ft Myers.
- 1889 Merchant Howell F. Parker, first postmaster and first mayor of Ft Myers, opens his own bank.
- 1889 Peter O. Knight, a 24-year old FM mayor, moves to Tampa with his wife, the former Lillie Frierson, and establishes law firm that will become Holland & Knight.
- 1891 Henry Plant opens the Tampa Bay Hotel.
- 1891 The Town of Trabue, in present Charlotte County, Fla., changes its name to Punta Gorda.
- 1892 In response to pressure from women's groups and religious leaders, the State of Fla agrees to set aside lands for the Seminole Indians.
- 1893 The Women's Indian Missionary Society deeds its Seminole Mission to the Episcopal Church.
- 1894 Cyrus Teed brings his followers to Estero, FL ("New Jerusalem").
- 1894 The Great Freeze (18 degrees F in Orlando on Dec. 29th).
- 1896 Florida East Coast Railway reaches Biscayne Bay.
- 1896 Minnie Moore Wilson publishes "The Seminoles of Florida."
- 1898 USS Maine (ACR-1) sinks in Havana harbor. Boat is 324' long, 57' beam, and 22.5' draft. Over 250 killed.
- 1898 Royal Palm Hotel opens and Fort Myers is nationally known as a winter resort.
- 1901 Edison begins spending winters in Ft. Myers.
- 1901 William Sherman Jennings begins term as governor.
- 1901 President McKinley assassinated on September 6th.
- 1901 Major James Evans, a lifelong batchelor, dies in Ft Myers, Fla, and is buried in his hometown of Suffolk, VA.
- 1904 Atlantic Coast Line (ACL) railway extended 28- miles to Fort Myers from Punta Gorda (May 10, 1904)
- 1905 Napolean B. Broward begins term as governor.
- 1906 The "Elections of 1906": Cyrus Teed suffers head injury that is believed to later cause his death.
- 1906 Franklin Miles, founder of Miles Laboratories, begins a buying spree of prominent homesites in Lee County, amassing numerous riverfront parcels.
- 1908 Cyrus Teed dies.
- 1909 Albert W. Gilchrist begins term as governor.
- 1911 Barron Collier visits Useppa Island and later purchases it for \$100,000.
- 1911 Dr. William Hanson and his son, Newton, die during December.
- 1913 Park Trammel begins term as governor.
- 1913 The Seminole Indian Association is organized and chartered, with F.A. Hendry president and W. Stanley Hanson, treasurer.
- 1913 Seminoles of Florida recognized as a separate entity from the Seminole Nation residing in Oklahoma.
- 1913 The San Carlos Cigar Company, a manufacturing concern, opens in Ft Myers, employing 25.

- 1914 Henry Ford and his family camp in the Everglades with the Edisons.
- 1914 World War I begins.
- 1914 First Ford Car Dealership was opened in Fort Myers.
- 1915 Construction begins on the "north-south" section of the Tamiami Trail.
- 1916 Henry Ford purchases the Gilliland property for \$20,000, later to become the site of "The Mangoes".
- 1917 Sidney Johnstone Cotts begins term as governor.
- 1918 World War I ends.
- 1919 Construction of Tamiami Trail stops because Lee County is not able to complete it's section of the road.
- 1921 Terry family donates 25-acres for Terry Park.
- 1921 Cary A. Hardee begins term as governor.
- 1923 Tamiami Trail "blazers", a group of west coast businessmen, leave Fort Myers for Miami during April.
- 1923 Collier County is created by act of legislature (May 8, 1923).
- 1923 Tamiami Trail construction begins during October 1923.
- 1924 Construction of Tamiami Trail bridge across river is completed and spurs growth in Fort Myers.
- 1925 Connie Mack and the Philadelphia Athletics begin spring training at Terry Park.
- 1925 John W. Martin begins term as governor.
- 1926 Edison Park is completed and dedicated on April 7th. James D. Newton markets residential lots.
- 1926 The Miami-Hurricane, noted for putting an end to the Florida Land Boom of the 1920s.
- 1928 Tamiami Trail, at a cost of \$8.0 million or \$25,000 per mile, is opened on April 26, 1928.
- 1928 Lake Okeechobee Hurricane, killing over 1,800 people, hits Palm Beach on Sept. 16th.
- 1929 US financial markets collapse and the Great Depression begins.
- 1929 Doyle Carlton begins term as governor.
- 1929 Henry Ford moves Edison's Menlo Park laboratory to Deerfield, MI. Ford would also remove the FM laboratory.
- 1929 Bok Tower Sanctuary is completed in Lake Wales, Fla.
- 1931 Edison dies on October 18, 1931. Henry Ford discontinues his visits to Ft. Myers.
- 1931 W Stanley Hanson takes members of the Seminole tribe to Washington, DC, to meet with members of U.S. legislative body and others.
- 1933 David Scholtz begins term as governor.
- 1933 Prohibition ends as the 18th Amendment is repealed.
- 1933 New Deal program begins and the WPA builds roads and schools throughout Florida.
- 1933 Architect Nathaniel Gaillard Walker and workers employed by the WPA complete the federal building in Ft Myers.
- 1935 Labor Day Hurricane, the strongest in US history, hits Florida Keys on Sept. 2nd, killing over 400.
- 1936 Cypress Gardens tourist attraction opens near Winter Haven.
- 1937 Fred P. Cone begins term as governor.
- 1938 Edison Pageant of Light is created to commemorate the Thomas Edison's life of achievement.
- 1938 US nears the end of the Great Depression.
- 1938 Marineland tourist attraction opens south of St. Augustine.
- 1939 Barron Collier dies at the age of 66. Largest land owner in Florida.
- 1939 World War II begins.
- 1940 New Deal program ends as the US economy reaches the end of the Great Depression.
- 1941 Spessard Holland begins term as governor.
- 1942 Construction begins on the Buckingham Army Airfield, an aircraft gunner base: \$10.0 million, 7,000 acres.
- 1943 Florida's first commercial oil well (Sunniland).
- 1944 Flovd Ellis is elected sheriff of Lee County, Florida.
- 1945 Millard F. Caldwell begins term as Florida governor.
- 1945 Henry Ford sells his estate to the Biggar family, who retains it for over 40-years.
- 1945 World War II ends.
- 1945 W. Stanley Hanson, known as the "White Medicine Man", dies on April 5th.
- 1947 Mina Edison deeds the Edison Estate to the citizens of Ft. Myers.
- 1947 Marjorie Stoneman Douglas' The Everglades: River of Grass is published to wide acclaim.
- 1948 Flanders "Snag" Thompson elected sheriff of Lee County.
- 1949 Fuller Warren begins term as Florida governor.
- 1953 Daniel T. McCarty begins term as Florida governor.
- 1955 LeRoy Collins begins term as Florida governor.
- 1955 Lee Ratner acquires 18,000 acres of land that becomes Lehigh Acres.
- 1957 Seminole Tribe of Florida, Inc. is created in response to the Indian Reorganization Act.
- 1958 Cape Coral's first home is constructed.
- 1959 Cuban immigration leads to a large wave of Cuban immigrants.
- 1960 Hurricane Donna hits Fort Myers on September 10th.
- 1961 C. Farris Bryant begins term as Florida governor.
- 1962 Miccosukee Indian Tribe of Florida is created in response to the Indian Reorganization Act.
- 1962 Cuban Missle Crisis during October 1962.
- 1962 Edison Junior College admits its first student.
- 1962 Caloosahatchee Bridge opened in 1962.
- 1963 Sanibel Causeway, connecting Sanibel and mainland Lee County, opens on May 26, 1963.
- 1963 President Kennedy assassinated on November 22nd.
- 1965 W. Haydon Burns begins term as Florida governor.
- 1967 Claude Kirk begins term as Florida governor.
- 1968 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. is assasinated in Memphis, TN, on April 4th.
- 1968 Robert F. Kennedy is assasinated in Los Angeles, CA, on June 5th.
- 1969 Apollo 11, on July 20, becomes first spacecraft to land humans on the moon.
- 1969 Woodstock Music & Art Fair takes place in Bethel, NY, during August.

- 1970 Kent State shootings. On May 4, 1970, four student protestors are killed by the National Guard.
- 1971 Reubin Askew begins term as Florida governor.
- 1971 Disney opens the Magic Kingdom, the first component of Disney World.
- 1972 Frank Wanicka defeats Flanders "Snag" Thompson to become sheriff of Lee County, Florida.
- 1974 Richard Milhous Nixon resigns as the 37th president of the US, on August 8, 1974.
- 1975 Viet Nam conflict ends as Saigon falls on April 30, 1975.
- 1977 Interstate 75 completed from Tampa to Sault Ste. Marie, on December 21, 1977.
- 1979 Bob Graham begins term as Florida governor.
- 1983 Southwest Florida International Airport (RSW) certified for operation in May 1983.
- 1983 Totch Brown, an Everglades City fishing guide, is arrested and convicted for drug smuggling.
- 1986 Final stretch of Interstate 75 in south Florida is completed.
- 1987 Bob Martinez begins term as Florida governor.
- 1989 Edison Festival of Light, Inc. assumes responsibility for public pageant events.
- 1991 Lawton Chiles begins term as Florida governor.
- 1991 Mikhail Baryshnikov stars in a benefit to raise funds to restore the Arcade theatre in downtown Ft Myers.
- 1992 FGCU site is chosen.
- 1997 FGCU holds first classes during August 1997.
- 1999 Jeb Bush begins term as Florida governor.
- 2010 Fort Myers population 62,298 (US Census).
