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MINUTES REPORT EAGLE TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE (ETAC) Tuesday, May 15, 2018

Introduction

Ms. Greeno called the meeting to order at 3:02 PM in the second floor conference room 2C of the Community Development/Public Works Center, 1500 Monroe Street, Ft. Myers, Florida.

Approve Meeting Minutes – April 10, 2018

Mr. Elms moved to approve the April 10, 2018 meeting minutes. Mr. Myers seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Member Reports

Mr. Elms said the Riverbend, Singing Pines, Bayshore Commons, the latest reiteration of that nest had three young that have presumably have fledged. On May 8th he saw the three chicks there and on May 14th they were gone so he thinks they have all fledged. He saw one adult near the nest tree eating a squirrel. He said the Donald Road/Bayshore nest had two young fledge and he hasn't seen anything there since April 24th. He stopped going to Moody River and Lalonde because there was no activity from September to February and permitted construction started at both sites. There was still the partial nest at Lalonde. Ms. Sweigert said she was driving on Pondella by the cell tower and there was an adult and what looked like a first year chick perched on there so she thinks they're still somewhere behind that tower where we can't see them yet. Mr. Elms said last year that had a partial nest and he saw adults there for a little while. Ms. Sweigert said she feels they're using it more as a perch observation area. Mr. Elms said there were two adults last week at the top of a tower at the corner of Donald and Coon.

Mr. Myers said St. Charles Harbor had two that he assumed fledged successfully. A & W Bulb wasn't being used. He asked if we need a gate code to get into Caloosa Palms. Ms. Sweigert said the gate was always open when she went. She said it was late in the

season when she went and there was just that small platform nest and she didn't see any chicks or anything either. Mr. Myers said he'd start checking that in October. He said Daniels Market Place had two that fledged. Robalo had three that fledged. Jonathon Harbor had nothing this year, a lot of pine bark beetle damage in those pines. The eagles were there at Alico Road in the beginning of the season but he didn't see any young. At Lakes Park he sees Ospreys there more than the eagles now. Pub & Pickle had two that successfully fledged he's assuming. When he was there, one was gone and the other was at the very top of the nest tree. Lexington Middle School had one that he assumes successfully fledged. It was in the nest when he was there and it was huge. At Sanibel Sunset Villas he assumes the one fledged, but a man who lives right next to the nest, Wade, said they saw a young one fledge to a tree one time and never saw it again. Wade looked around but didn't find anything. Ms. Sweigert said they have waited to do some needed roof repairs. She said the nest at the BMX park in Cape Coral had three chicks that didn't make it. Mr. Elms said they think great horned owls may have gotten in there.

Ms. Greeno said the Lehigh nest had two fledge. Ms. Sweigert said she saw nothing at Lucket, not even a bird this year. Mr. Myers asked if she thought they could've gone to the area nine. Ms. Sweigert said it's possible, or they could've gone further east. Ms. Greeno said through Bob Janes, may be the Fowler nest, there are two birds with an adult this year that are around the area of Telegraph Creek Preserve on North River Road. Ms. Sweigert said we have it historically off the south side of Duke Highway, there were nests there on Fowlers Way, but it's a private road and the last time she drove down there, there was a house and the vegetation's grown up so much you can't see anything. She said at the old Carter property by the airstrip she saw an active nest with one chick and one adult this year. It's in the same tree in the same area and she was surprised it was back, but that pair moves quite a bit.

2017-2018 Nesting Season Wrap-Up

Ms. Sweigert said we haven't been able to finish up the GIS and Mr. Laskowski is still diligently working on it. Our goal is to transfer the data to the consultant community, hopefully this summer. Then we can produce to you the examples from last nesting season and this nesting season in that format. We're thinking we'll just do the last 5 years running history, with that as the attribute table, the Excel that goes with that data point, verses doing the entire thing because that would get messy. We'll keep that historic data but what we'll display is just a five year history. That made sense when we were brainstorming through that process.

Ms. Sweigert said we may need to have one summer meeting this year as a zoning case has come in for a large parcel of property on Coon Road, just to the south of the Bayshore Commons nest. They may not be aware that they need to do a management plan. Mr. Laskowski said they want to build a house for the parents, then another house for the daughter and husband at a later time, and a horse stable and accessories for chickens, etc. He said the property where they can build with the eagles is all in coastal high hazard. Ms. Sweigert said the summer meeting will probably be in August and she will ask members for dates at the time.

Ms. Sweigert said at the Jonathan Harbour nest site that has all the pine boring beetles and damage, the owner has obtained a permit from the US Fish & Wildlife Service to remove the nest tree and other dead trees because he's getting ready to build. We're working on getting them to replant slash pines, and there are still some great pines near the entrance. She explained to the owner that just because they removed the tree it doesn't mean the territory is considered abandoned or lost. They're under the same restrictions, so come nesting season they'll need to stop and do exactly like we do with everyone in an active territory. There's still potential there for them to find another tree. Mr. Elms said assuming the birds come back. Ms. Sweigert said most of the houses in there take from 2 to 3 years because they're quite large. Ms. Elms said most of the pines there, even the ones to the south, are dying now. Ms. Sweigert said they're taking out some on the HOA property to help stop the proliferation of the beetles. Unfortunately 2 really good pines behind one house that would work may be too close to the house for the birds. The hope is maybe we can get it cleaned up and stop the pine boring beetles spread and reestablish some pine trees. Ms. Greeno asked when an eagle was seen there last. Mr. Myers said he saw them at the beginning of the season. Ms. Sweigert said they hung out in the territory and began building a small structure then stopped. Ms. Myers said he saw the adults in November and December but not after that. Ms. Sweigert said we thought maybe the Sanibel Court was that pair, but she doesn't think so because they were still seen in the other territory on same dates. Ms. Greeno said the odds are good they'll come back next year. Ms. Sweigert said they've been there since around 2002.

Ms. Sweigert said some ETAC members may be getting reappointment letters soon. She thanked members for filling out the form and staying on.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting adjourned at 3:31 p.m.

Becky,

Good morning. I hope all is well with you. I am writing on behalf of my client Hyatt Hotel and Time Share Condos (Hyatt) concerning the former eagle nest on its property. Hyatt is continuing to develop the property at Coconut Pointe. Hyatt has been monitoring the tree which was formerly the location of an eagle nest. The eagle nest was last occupied by an eagle in a failed attempt at breeding in 2013- 14. The nest showed signs of failing at that time and was subsequently taken over by owls the following season. The nest collapsed and at present nothing remains. Attached is monitoring and reporting information submitted on behalf of Hyatt to the USFWS.

As you know this former eagle nest required the imposition of several conditions on the Lee County development approval for this project. These conditions were to comply with local eagle protection ordinances which mirror the Federal protections to avoid the harm or disturbance of protected eagles. We have recently provided the USFWS with County and private monitoring of the former nest tree and requested relief from further monitoring and construction restriction requirements. In response we received the attached letter agreeing that given that the last nesting attempt was in the 2013-2014 season and the disintegration and disappearance of the nest since 2015, that monitoring and construction restrictions are no longer necessary.

Therefore given the abandonment, then loss and destruction of this eagle nest, as recognized by the USFWS, we would request on behalf of our client, agreement to allow the cessation for this development of any County requirements for eagle monitoring and construction restrictions for the protection of eagles concerning this former nest site.

If you would like to meet or have a conference call to discuss this request we will make ourselves available at your convenience. Since the eagle nesting season will resume in October we would appreciate your prompt consideration of this matter. Thank you.

2017-2018 Bald Eagle Monitoring Summary Report Submittal

This letter is written to provide the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) with a copy of the 2017-2018 bald eagle monitoring summary report regarding nest tree LE-028C, located in Lee County, Florida. Below please find a final summary of the bald eagle monitoring performed from February 21, 2017 to May 15, 2018:

On February 21, 2017, Stantec senior ecologist Tom Trettis, CSE, PWS, performed a site review of the Hyatt Coconut Plantation property to observe LE-028C. During the site visit, no nest, branches, twigs, or any remnant of a bald eagle nest occurring within the LE-028C tree was observed. During the site review, two (2) adult bald eagles were observed within the 330' buffer zone established for LE-028C. No bald eagle mating, courtship, or nest building activities were observed during the referenced site review.

On April 10 and 11, 2017, Mr. Trettis performed a bald eagle nesting season survey of habitats occurring within the LE-028C 660' eagle nest protection zone. No nest, branches, twigs, or any remnant of a bald eagle nest within the LE-028C tree was observed during the survey. No new or "alternate" bald eagle nests were observed occurring within the LE-028C protection zone. This bald eagle nesting season survey was conducted to determine whether a new or "alternate" bald eagle nest had been constructed within the LE-028C 660' protection zone. Meandering pedestrian transects were performed in suitable bald eagle nesting habitats within the LE-028C 660' protection zone. During this survey, two (2) adult bald eagles were observed within the 330' buffer zone established for LE-028C. No bald eagle mating, courtship, or nest building activities were observed during the site reviews.

During August 2017, Mr. Trettis contacted Ms. Ulgonda Kirkpatrick (USFWS) to discuss performing a helicopter fly-over of the LE-028C project area to search for bald eagle nests prior to the start of the 2017-2018 bald eagle nesting season. On September 29, 2017 a helicopter fly-over of bald eagle nest tree LE-028C, and adjacent lands, was performed by pilot Joe Frangione (London Aviation) and Mr. Trettis. The purpose of the flight was to determine whether any bald eagle nests occur within a 660' radius of the Hyatt Coconut Plantation property boundary. No bald eagle individuals or nests were observed occurring within 660' of the Hyatt Coconut Plantation property boundary during the helicopter fly-over. Additional time was spent



bald eagle nesting season. ETAC data documented the bald eagle nest had fallen out of the LE-028C tree during the 2015-2016 eagle nesting season and only small twigs and branches remained. ETAC documented no bald eagle nesting activity in LE-028C during the 2016-2017 bald eagle nesting season and no nest material was present in the tree. Based on ETAC data, and data from the Stantec 2017-2018 bald eagle nesting season monitoring, LE-028C has been inactive for a period of four (4) consecutive years.

We trust the provided information, photographs, exhibits, and documents are sufficient for staff review and approval. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions regarding this matter.

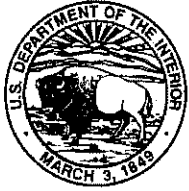

We have received your request regarding construction restrictions and monitoring for a Lee County, Florida, Bald Eagle nest identified as LE-028C. Bald Eagle nest LE-028C was located on property originally owned by WCI Communities Inc. for a project titled Pelican Landing Golf Resort Ventures, LLC, which was subject of a Service Biological Opinion # 4-1-05-PL-9465 under the Endangered Species Act and a subsequent Bald Eagle EAESA Permit MB 218239 under the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act. Your client, Hyatt Hotel Time Share Cordos, purchased this property from WCI Communities Inc. and has continued monitoring the eagle nest site. The eagle's last suspected nesting attempt, which was a failure, was in 2013-2014 and the nest has been disintegrating since 2015 and has now disappeared from the nest tree.

We have reviewed the pertinent federal regulations and the file for the Bald Eagle Take Exempted Under the Endangered Species Act (EAESA) Permit MB 218239 issued to WCI Communities Inc. on June 17, 2009, authorizing the take of Bald Eagles in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Endangered Species Act (ESA) Section 7 incidental take statement and Biological Opinion # 4-1-05-PL-9465, titled Pelican Landing Golf Resort Ventures, LLC, and dated November 16, 2004.

We have determined that Federal regulation 50 CFR 13.25 restricts transfer of permits to Eagle Take (Disturbance) permits issued under 50 CFR 22.26 permits and to EAESA incidental take permits issued under 50 CFR 22.28. Therefore, WCI Communities Inc. had no authority to transfer the EAESA permit to Hyatt with the sale of the property. Accordingly, Hyatt is under no legal obligation to carry out any conservation measures related to the 50 CFR 22.28 EAESA permit.

We have also consulted with the Service's South Florida Ecological Services Office who issued the original Biological Opinion for this project property. Their response was that the National Bald Eagle Management Guidelines (2007) state that if there's information showing a nest has not been active during the preceding 5 breeding seasons, guidelines for avoiding disturbance around the nest site may no longer be warranted. If there has been no activity in 5 years, the Service has no objection to discontinue eagle monitoring. Boylan Environmental Consultants were under contract with the previous property owner to monitor bald eagle nest LE-028C from 2003 – 2007. Here are there results:

- **Nest Constructed December 2003 – no nesting documented**
- **2004 - 2005 – (2) chicks confirmed**
- **2005 - 2006 – (1) Nesting failure documented**
- **2006 - 2007 – (2) chicks confirmed**

The Lee County Eagle Technical Advisory Committee (ETAC) monitored nest LE-028C from 2008 to the current date. Here are the results:
