**SUBJECT: Waste Tire Cutting Services** 

The waste to energy facility receives approximately 3000 tons of waste tires for disposal each year. In order to burn this amount of tires effectively to produce energy, it is necessary to cut them into pieces.

In 1999 Contracts Management and the Solid Waste Division solicited letters of interest from vendors capable of transporting and shearing waste tires such that the tires could be efficiently utilized for fuel at the waste to energy facility (see attached blue sheet). The result of that project yielded only one company, Modern Recycling, Inc. of Bonita Springs, that would perform the required services at the stipulated not-to-exceed price. A service provider agreement was established for one year and two additional one-year extensions were exercised.

It is necessary to continue this service and, again, the only company that can competitively deliver the transportation and cutting services is Modern Recycling (Modern). Modern is a local company offering waste tire collection and disposal/recycling services to many business throughout Lee County. Additionally, Modern has been the County's provider of playground tire mulch, at the least cost available, for several years and offers other products made from recycled waste tires.

The Solid Waste Division has solicited informal telephone pricing for tire cutting services and again, Modern offers the least cost though at a price, substantially higher than the previous three years. Other companies providing this type of service are on the east coast of Florida and cannot compete because of the transportation requirement. It is necessary for the vendor to collect the tires at the WTE move them to an off-site location for cutting, and return the pieces to the WTE. The Solid Waste Division's only other option is to purchase and install a rotary tire shear and perform the work onsite requiring an estimated capital investment of approximately \$450,000.

Therefore, we are recommending an agenda item to be considered by the Board of County Commissioners to waive the formal solicitation process and enter into a service provider agreement with Modern Recycling, Inc. The cost will be \$35 per ton, compared to the current cost of \$25 per ton. However, Modern will reduce the cost of playground mulch by \$25 per ton. Modern will also transport sheared tires to the Lee/Hendry landfill, if required, at no additional cost.
