Drug Court (\$90,000)

To increase the number of participants from (50) to eighty (80). The Lee County Drug Court Program is a combined effort of the State Attorney's Office, Public Defender's Office, the Court, the Department of Corrections (DOC), Lee County Sheriff's Office, Clerk of Courts, and Community Health Care Drug Abuse Service providers. Estimated cost of the Drug Court Treatment for one (1) year per participant is \$3,000.

Lee County Youth Ranch (\$80,000)

Funds will be used to hire a coordinator for approximately 18 months to 2 years. The Youth Ranch will concentrate on preventing crime, mentoring, and developing community partnerships to work with our youth. This position is critical to the future success of this endeavor.

Software Program (\$66,232)

Software designed to maximize staffing levels at the lowest cost. By using actual historical data and real time events the supervisors can plan and react in a manner that increases coverage, while reducing crime and overtime cost.

The Lee County Sheriff's Office looks forward to working with Lee County Coalition for a Drug Free Southwest Florida.
