An estimated \$377,000 is required to operate and maintain Terry Park. This amount includes personnel and infrastructure maintenance costs. Funds come from user fees and concessions associated with ballpark activities and general revenue funds.

Restoration of Terry Park will allow visitors an opportunity to see a stadium as it once was when legendary players played a sport that continues to impact the local economy of Florida. Baseball provides youth with positive adult role models and opportunities to develop math skills by calculating common baseball statistics such as "at-bats, hits, runs, home runs, walks" etc. Visitors to Terry Park will also learn how Spring Training has impacted the economy of South Florida. According to the Florida Sports Foundation (2000) spring training can bring in as much as \$18million each spring to the State

Restoration of Terry Park will include a museum to honor the legendary players who played at Terry Park. Roberto Clemente, the first Latino in the Baseball Hall of Fame, is among these players. The ballpark also hosts the annual Lee County Hispanic Festival. All facilities at the ballpark are accessible to individuals with disabilities.

Terry Park is located in the State designated Enterprise Zone and HUD designated Champion Community section of the City of Fort Myers. This area of the city received these designations due to the level of poverty in the surrounding community and the need for community revitalization. The City is currently undergoing a redevelopment plan for Palm Beach Boulevard – a major transportation corridor to the City which passes in front of Terry Park. The restoration of Terry Park will boost the City's efforts by developing a major tourism/educational attraction along the Palm Beach corridor.
