for compliance prior to a certificate of occupancy. The increase in commercial and residential construction in Lee County over							
the past year has exceeded the ability of Health Department staff to maintain a level of inspection services demanded by the							
building industry. Presently, it takes 5 to 6 weeks "turn around" time from application receipt to permit issuance. Increasing							
the OSTDS permit and inspection fees from \$200 to \$340 will enable the Health Department to hire additional staff to provide an acceptable level of service. Anticipated "turn ground" time with additional staff will be 2 weeks. Charten 154, E.S. (2002)

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR AN INCREASE TO THE LEE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT SERVICE FEES FOR PERMITTING AND INSPECTION SERVICES OF "ON SITE SEWAGE TREATMENT AND DISPOSAL SYSTEMS"; PROVIDING FOR AUTHORIZATION; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Lee County, Florida is the governing body in and for Lee County, a political subdivision and charter county of the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Lee County Health Department is mandated by Chapter 381, Florida Statutes to issue a permit for the installation of all On Site Sewage Treatment and Disposal Systems (OSTDS) prior to the issuance of a building permit and to inspect such system for compliance prior to a certificate of occupancy; and

WHEREAS, the Lee County Health Department is authorized to establish charges and collect reasonable fees in connection with services performed by said Health Department by virtue of Chapter 154, Florida Statutes, as amended, and other applicable statues and laws of the State of Florida; and authorizes the Board of County Commissioners to establish a schedule of fees for the local health department; and

WHEREAS, the increase in residential and commercial construction in Lee County has necessitated the need of Lee County Health Department to increase its staff to provide an acceptable level of service for applications to permit and inspect OSTDS; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Lee County Health Department and Lee Building Industry Association has recommended approval to increase the OSTDS permit and inspection fees from \$200 to \$340.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEE COUNTY, THAT:

<u>Section 1</u>. Pursuant to Chapter 154, Florida Statutes, the Board of County Commissioners hereby authorizes the Lee County Health Department to increase the OSTDS permit and inspection fees from \$200 to \$340.

Section 2. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the Board of County Commissioners at a regularly scheduled meeting. The Lee Building Industry Association supports the additional local user fee for septic tank permits that will expedite the plan review, permitting and inspection of septic tank systems by the Health Department.
