A RESOLUTION OF LEE COUNTY AMENDING LEE COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 03-07-08, "DECLARING A LIMITED, TEMPORARY EMERGENCY RELATIVE TO THE ACQUISITION OF THE GULF ENVIRONMENTAL SYSTEM"; PROVIDING FOR AN EXTENSION TO THE TERM; ADDING ADDITIONAL LEE COUNTY UTILITIES PROJECTS TO EXHIBIT A; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on July 1, 2003, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Lee County Resolution No. 03-07-08 relating to declaring a limited, temporary emergency as the result of the County's acquisition of the Gulf Environmental Utility System ("GES"); and,

WHEREAS, Lee County Resolution No. 03-07-08 established a fixed term and certain parameters for the limited, temporary emergency; and,

WHEREAS, the County has now determined through its Division of Utilities, that an extension to the term of Resolution No. 03-07-08, along with the addition of certain other ancillary Utilities projects, meet the criteria to become a part of the intent of the Resolution; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Lee County ("Board") now desires to amend Resolution No. 03-07-08 by extending the term for an additional six (6) months, and by adding certain, identified projects to be covered by the Resolution; and,

WHEREAS, the Board finds that such amendment serves a public purpose and is for the public's benefit.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Exhibit A

The following list provides the description of the immediate improvements <u>and ancillary projects</u> needed by Lee County Utilities to ensure and enhance regulatory compliance and uninterrupted water, wastewater and reclaimed water services to the San Carlos and Estero area customers, <u>as well as portions of other Lee County Utilities systems in need of immediate action:</u>

- 1. San Carlos Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements.
- 2. Bartow (San Carlos) Water Treatment Plant Improvements.
- 3. Three Oaks Wastewater Treatment Plant expansion completion and improvements.
- 4. GES Corkscrew Water Treatment Plant (Pinewoods Water Treatment Plant) deep injection well addition, wellfield expansion and general improvements.
- 5. Improvements and connection to approximately 50 sewage lift stations.
- 6. Improvements to existing GES water distribution system.
- 7. Installation of necessary water main extensions to enhance water pressure and quality in specific sectors of GES.

PROJECTS TO BE ADDED

- 8. **CIP 7239 Pine Island WWTP Expansion**: The County purchased a used plant with a 500,000 GPD capacity. This plant needs to be installed immediately at the PIWWTP site in order to provide sufficient service capacity to Pine Island.
- 9. **CIP 7104 Green Meadows WTP Improvements:** Replacement of the High Service pumps at the GM plant is needed to satisfy the need to send sufficient potable water to the customers of the GES system from this plant.
- 10. CIP 7105 Green Meadows / Corkscrew Interconnect: The main portion of this project is under construction, however, an additional main line extension is needed in order to insure sufficient raw water supply.
- 11. CIP 7265 Olga WTP Reservoir & Plant Improvements: The WTP is in need of immediate improvements, and due to the substantial increase in the County's water demand, the Olga facilities need to be brought to current standards ASAP.
- 12. CIP 7138 The Waterway Estates WWTP: The WWTP is in need of emergency repairs in order to continue to provide current service levels to customers.

As the result, the Emergency Procurement Waivers are requested to be applied to the following for the above Projects:

- 1. Mechanical equipment and services (i.e., pumps, gearboxes, tanks, filters, welding, fabricating, steel, etc.).
- 2. Electrical components (i.e., safety switches, breakers, conduit, variable speed drives, wiring, lighting, etc.).
- 3. Dewatering equipment (i.e., pumps, wellpoints, headers, etc.).
- 4. Telemetry equipment and services (i.e., remote terminal units, computers, sensors, communication equipment, etc.).
- 5. Raw sewage, lift station equipment (i.e., pumps, generators, electrical panels, precast structures, etc.).
- 6. Building supplies.
- 7. Security and intrusion prevention systems (i.e., closed circuit cameras, motor sensors, fence equipment, etc.).
- 8. Chemical supplies (i.e., chlorine [bleach], sulfuric acid, fluoride, carbon dioxide, powdered activated charcoal, etc.).
- 9. Heavy equipment purchases and rentals (i.e., excavators, jack and bore equipment, directional boring equipment, backhoes, forklifts, trucks, etc.).
- 10. Electric motor rewinding services.
