- Whereas: Lee County Parks and Recreation Staff and volunteers promote environmental awareness and good health by offering guided educational programs along these trails; and
- Whereas: There will be a free guided walk conducted beginning at 9:00 am June 5, 2004 in the following six locations: Caloosahatchee Regional Park, Hickey's Creek Mitigation Park, Manatee Park, Six Mile Cypress Slough Preserve, Bowditch Point Park and Matanzas Preserve.

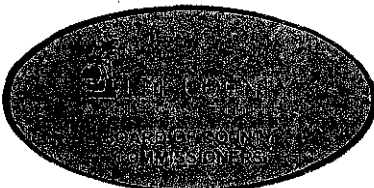
