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BYLAWS OF THE TANGLEWOOD RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION, INC.

PREAMBLE. The previous Constitutions and Bylaws of The Tanglewood Residents Association, Inc. last amended on April 16, 1996 are hereby rescinded and these Bylaws adopted on April 17, 2001.

ARTICLE I. NAME, LOCATION, AND ADDRESS

The name of the organization shall be the TANGLEWOOD RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION Inc. (hereafter called the Association); a non-profit Florida Corporation whose principal office is located in Fort Myers, Lee County, Florida and whose mailing address is Fort Myers, Florida.

ARTICLE II. OBJECT

- Section 1. The Association has been formed to provide an opportunity, using democratic processes, for the residents of the Tanglewood Subdivision (hereafter called Tanglewood) to:
 - a. Promote better community understanding of our Bylaws and Deed Restrictions for the households located in the subdivision,
 - b. Provide improvements of the public areas in the subdivision,
 - c. Jointly promote the continual improvement of the neighborhood,
 - d. Take such joint actions as may seem appropriate to protect the health, safety, and well being of the residents,
 - e. Support the enforcement of the Subdivision's deed of restrictions and their amendments in order to maintain property values in Tanglewood.
 - f. Cooperate with other civic groups and various agencies of government (when permitted by a non-profit corporation) as they consider plans and programs for the area.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP AND VOTING RIGHTS

- Section 1. Membership in the Association shall be open to all residents and property owners of Tanglewood.
- Section 2. Membership shall be on a household basis, one membership per household. A household shall consist of one or more individuals residing permanently in the same household.
- Section 3. There shall be no age requirements pertaining to membership, and there shall be no minimum period of residence for a resident to become a member.
- Section 4. Each household shall have only one vote.
- Section 5. Membership in the Association shall be entirely voluntary and the Association shall have no powers to levy assessments against any member. Annual dues shall be recommended by the Board of Directors and approved by a majority of the membership present at the Annual Meeting. Payment of dues is a qualification for membership in the Association.

ARTICLE IV. THE GOVERNANCE OF THE ASSOCIATION

Section 1. The governance of the Association shall consist of a Board of Directors of nine (9) members, which include four (4) officers. The term of office of the Board of Directors shall be three (3) years, that of the officers one (1) year. Directors and officers may be re-elected. The President may succeed himself for a maximum of three (3) consecutive one (1) year terms. Terms of office for the Board of Directors shall be on a staggered basis with three (3) Directors' offices being open for election each year.

Section 2. The Board of Directors shall elect the President, the Vice President, the Secretary and the Treasurer. Election of the new officers shall take place at a Special Meeting of the Board of Directors held immediately following the Annual Meeting. The new Board Members and the officers shall assume office immediately upon their election.

Section 3. The President, or in his or her absence or disability, the Vice President, or a Director of the Association shall preside at all Directors', Special and Membership Meetings. The President shall have general supervision over the affairs of the Association and over the other officers, shall appoint committees and shall perform all such other duties as are incident to this office.

Section 4. The Secretary shall issue notices of all Directors', Special and Membership Meetings, and shall attend and keep the minutes of the same; shall have charge of all Association minutes, correspondence and membership rosters and shall perform all such duties as are incident to this office. In case of absence or disability of the Secretary, a Secretary Pro-tem appointed by the President or substitute shall perform his or her duties.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall have custody of all money and securities of the Association; shall keep regular books of account; shall submit them, together with all his or her vouchers, receipts, records, and other papers to the Directors for their examination and approval as often as they may require; shall submit and distribute an annual written report at the Annual Meeting; and shall perform all other duties as are incident to the office. In case of the absence or disability of the Treasurer, a Treasurer Pro-tem appointed by the President or his substitute shall perform the duties. The Treasurer shall be bonded in such sum as the Directors may require and the fee paid by the Association. The funds of the Association shall be deposited intact in such banks or trust companies as the Directors shall from time to time designate and such funds so deposited shall be withdrawn only upon check or order signed by the Treasurer and one (1) other Officer designated by the Board of Directors. Any member shall have access to the books and records for examination at any reasonable time.

Section 6. The Association fiscal year will coincide with the calendar year.

ARTICLE V. MEETINGS

Section 1. Board of Directors

- a. The Board of Directors shall hold their regular meetings on a quarterly basis and in the months of January, April, July and October, or otherwise as determined by the Board of Directors.
- b. Either a majority of the Directors or the President may call Special Meetings of the Board of Directors.
- c. Except for Special Meetings called on short notice, the Secretary shall notify the Directors seven (7) days before a meeting.
- d. Notification of a Special Meeting shall include the business to be transacted at the

Special Meeting. Only business mentioned in the notification of the Special Meeting shall be conducted.

e. Five Directors shall constitute a quorum.

Section 2. Association

- a. The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held in November.
- b. A Spring Meeting of the Association may be held in April.
- c. Either a majority of the Directors or the President or one tenth of the membership may call a Special Meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE VI. BOARD OF DIRECTORS - ELECTION - REMOVAL FROM OFFICE

Section 1. At the Annual Meeting the Chairman of the Nominating Committee shall read the names of the nominees and introduce those present to the membership. Other nominations of members, who have agreed to serve if elected, can be made from the floor following which the nominations will be closed.

Section 2. The President shall then appoint one judge of elections and three (3) clerks to tally the vote. Immediately thereafter, the election for the three-year positions on the Board of Directors shall take place, voting to be by secret ballot if there is more than a minimum slate; otherwise, the slate may be elected by acclamation. The nominees having the highest vote shall be elected. The Directors shall elect the officers for the coming year at a Special Meeting held immediately after the Annual Meeting.

- Section 3. The membership shall have the power to remove any Director from office. A petition for a vote of removal can be made to the President by twenty (20) members and shall be voted on by secret ballot at the next membership meeting. Removal requires the consent of a majority of the members present.
- Section 4. The absence, without justifiable reason, of a Director from three (3) consecutive meetings shall be interpreted to mean that the Director is no longer interested in fulfilling his or her responsibilities and his or her service shall be terminated.
- Section 5. Any vacancy that occurs in the Board of Directors shall be filled by temporary appointment by the President and approved by the Board of Directors. At the next Annual Membership Meeting the unexpired term shall be filled by a regular election.
- Section 6. The duties of the Board of Directors shall be to:
 - a. Elect the officers of the Association.
 - b. Manage the business and property of the Association.
 - c. Approve all expenditures.
 - d. Appoint the person or persons to officially represent the Association in all dealings with outside sources. If any expenses are involved in such a mission, such person or persons shall be reimbursed upon presentation of an itemized bill.
 - e. Transact any other business that comes before the Board.

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ARTICLE VII. COMMITTEES

Section 1. The President each year at the April Membership Meeting shall appoint an Audit Committee consisting of three (3) members who shall report to the membership at the Annual Meeting. The Treasurer may not be a member of the Audit Committee. The function of this committee is to audit the corporation's financial records.

Section 2. The President at the July Board Meeting shall appoint a Nominating Committee consisting of three (3) members at the July Board Meeting who shall report to the membership at the Annual Meeting. The President shall not be a member of this committee. All the nominees must have agreed to serve if elected. The function of this committee is to procure candidates to fill the seats of directors whose terms are expiring.

Section 3. The President at the July Board Meeting shall appoint a Budget Committee consisting of three (3) members who shall report to the membership at the Annual Meeting. The Treasurer shall be the Chairperson of this committee. The function of this committee is to develop a viable budget for the following fiscal year.

Section 4. The President at the January Board Meeting shall appoint a Restrictions Committee consisting of three (3) members. The function of this committee is to see that published policies and procedures are followed when suspected deed restrictions are reported.

Section 5. The President at the January Board Meeting shall appoint a Membership Committee consisting of three (3) members. The function of this committee is to see that new residents are welcomed and receive a copy of the Association Bylaws, a copy of the Deed Restrictions that apply to their Addition, and an invitation to join the Association.

Section 6. Committee Chairpersons shall be members of the Board. Committee members must be members of the Association.

ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

Section 1. Bylaws of the Association may be adopted, amended or rescinded by a majority vote of the members present at any regular Membership Meeting, or at any Special Meeting of the membership called for that purpose, provided that the proposed change or changes have been distributed to the membership at least ten (10) days in advance of the meeting.

ARTICLE IX, PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The latest edition of Roberts Rules of Order shall be recognized as the parliamentary authority at all Membership, Directors', and Special Meetings of the Association.

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE TANGLEWOOD IMPROVEMENT UNIT; DEFINING THE TERRITORY TO BE INCLUDED; ESTABLISHING THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AS THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE UNIT; PROVIDING FOR THE TYPE OF SERVICES WHICH MAY BE RENDRRED; PROVIDING FOR THE POWER TO LEVY SERVICE CHARGES, SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS OR 'TAXES WITHIN THE UNIT; PROVIDING FOR RECISSION OF RESOLUTION 75-5-18; PROVIDING FOR A FUND; SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, a notice of intent to enact an ordinance has been kept by the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners in a separate book which was open for public inspection during regular business hours and has been published in a newspaper of general circulation within Lee County at least fifteen (15) days prior to this meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners held a public hearing on the proposed ordinance to establish this municipal service taxing or benefit unit; and

WHEREAS, all 'persons having an interest in the municipal service taxing or benefit unit and the public at large were given an opportunity to be 'heard,

NOW, THEREFORE, 'BE IT ORDAINED DY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

SECTION 1

CREATION OF THE M.S.T.U., PURPOSE AND BOUNDARIES

Pursuant to the powers granted to the Board of County Commissioners of Lee County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as the "Board", by the Constitution of the State of Florida and the Florida Statutes, in particular, Section 125.01, Fla. Stat., the Board hereby creates a municipal service taxing or benefit unit to be known as the Tanglewood Improvement Unit. Unless expressly mandated by State statute or otherwise, any and all procedures, administrative or otherwise, which were required to be followed prior to the enactment of this ordinance shall be waived or considered directory in nature and non--compliance with the procedure shall have no effect upon the validity of this ordinance, constitutional or otherwise.

The purpose of the Tanglewood Improvement Unit is to provide the following municipal services within the 'boundaries of the M.S.T.J.:

The maintenance of the entrance to and the median strips including mowing, trimming, weeding, planting, fertilizing and watering; and,

1 2. To install or maintain an approved street lighting system.

The boundaries of the M.S.T.U. shall be as follows:

SECTION 2

THE GOVERNING BODY

The Board shall be the governing body of the Tanglewood Improvement M.S.T.U.

SECTION 3

THE GENERAL POWERS

The governing, body shall have all the powers necessary or convenient to carry out the purpose of this ordinance and such additional rights and powers as are provided by the Constitution of the State of Florida and the laws of the State of Florida as granted to counties. The governing body shall also have all the powers not otherwise prohibited by law and these powers shall include but are not limited to the power to:

- Sue, or be sued, complain or defend in the name of the County, in any and all courts or administrative agencies;
- Acquire by grant, purchase, gift, devise, exchange or in any other lawful manner, any property, real or personal, or any estate of interest therein upon such terms and conditions as the governing body shall determine;
- Enter into contracts with any public, private or municipal firm, person or corporation for the furnishing of the improvements within the boundaries of the M.S.T.U.;
- 4. Borrrow and expend 'money and issue bonds, revenue certificates, and other obligations of indebtedness in such manner and subject to such limitations as may be provided by law;
- 5. Levy and collect without referendum ad valorem taxes for the providing 'of municipal services within the M.S.T.U.; and
 - 6. Adopt rules and regulations governing the M.S.T.U.

AECTION

THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The governing body may appoint an 'advisory committee composed of no more than five (5) persons who reside within the boundaries of the Unit. The advisory committee shall prepare an annual budgetary estimate in accordance with the appropriate rules and regulations of the Board.

" SECTION 5

LEVYING AD VALOREM TAXES

Ad Valorem taxes levied pursuant to this ordinance shall be levied and a budget prepared and adopted by this Board after public hearings in the same manner as the Board prepares and adopts its annual County budget and levies taxes as provided by law. The levy of ad valorem taxes shall not exceed 0.5 mills, per year.

SECTION

TANGLEWOOD IMPROVEMENT FUND

There is hereby created a fund to be known as the "Tanglewood Improvement Unit Fund" from which the costs of any municipal service may be paid, either in whole or in part. This fund shall contain all special charges; special assessments, taxes, interest, and other monies collected or otherwise obtained pursuant to this ordinance or any subsequent resolution thereto.

SECTION 7

RESCISSION OF RESOLUTION 75-5-18

Resolution 75-5-18 adopted May 28, 1975, creating the Tanglewood Improvement District shall be rescinded effective May 28, 1984. All surplus monies of the Tanglewood Improvement District shall be transferred to the Tanglewood Improvement Unit Fund.

SECTION 8

SEVERABILITY

It is **declared to be** the legislative intent that if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provisions of this ordinance was held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance shall not be affected.

SECTION 9

EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall become effective upon 'receipt of acknowledgement', from the Secretary of State that the ordinance has been duly filed,

'URPOSE/SCOPE:

To set forth the responsibilities of the Municipal Services Taxing and $Benefit\ Unit\ Advisory\ Committees.$

OLICY/PROCEDURE:

- I. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE LEE.COUNTY CORRISSION:
 - A. To appoint five members to the Advisory Committee, selected from property owners residing in the Unit.
 - B. To provide staff to assist the <code>Committee</code> in carrying out its responsibilities.
 - C. To receive and consider recommendations from the Committee. For example, any proposed budgeted expenditures.
 - D. To adopt a budget for the Unit Fund.
 - ${\tt E.}$ To collect sufficient ${\tt funds.via}$ property taxes or special assessments to fund the budget.
- II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE:
 - A. To elect a **Chairman** and **Vice** Chairman from the members of the Committee. The Chairman shall appoint, from the membership, one person to act as Secretary. The **Secretary** shall sign all minutes along with the Chairman and. **submit** to the County within ten working days after each meeting.
 - B. To establish rules and conduct orderly meetings.
 - C. To review and monitor the annual budget and related expenditures.
 - D. To make recommendations to the County for expenditure of the funds within their budget in accordance with the Board of County Commissioners' proved purchasing guidelines.
 - ${\tt E.}$ To ${\tt make}$ recommendations to the Lee county Commission regarding the annual proposed budgets.

III. GENERAL INFORMATION:

- A. Meetings will be called by the Chairman of the Committee, or by the Board of County Commissioners. All meetings will be open to the public. Notice of meetings must be made seven days prior to the meeting through a notice in a newspaper of general circulation.
- B. All meetings will be conducted in a professional manner.
- C. The Secretary will record the proceedings of each meeting. These records will become the Official Records of the Committee. The original will be retainedy by the secretary and one copy will be submitted to the office designated y the county to administer the Unit.
- D. A member of any Board, Committee or Commission may not participate in the consideration of any matter in which the member has a private, financial or personal interest, if that interest would conflict with the member's impartial performance of public duties.
- E. On each Committee, one-half of the Committee will be appointed for a term of one year and the remainder of the Committee for two years. All subsequent appointments after the Committee has been functioning for one full year will be for a two-year term.
- F. The County Administrator, or designee, will be responsible for maintaining an accurate and up-to-date roster of all Committees and their respective members and will advise the Board of County Commissioners of the expiration of the term of a Committee Kember prior to such expiration.
- G. The County Commission will fill any vacancies by appointment.
- H. The Board of County Commissioners is authorized to dissolve Committees or rescind an appointment to a Committee by a vote of the majority of the Board of County Commission members.

Lee County Landscaping Funds Program

Scope of Work

History of the Tanglewood Residents Association and the Tanglewood MSTU

The Tanglewood Residents Association (aka TRA) was incorporated on June 3, 1974, as a non-profit corporation for the purpose of maintaining the quality and atmosphere of the Tanglewood subdivision.

On May 2, 1984, at the request of the TRA, the Tanglewood Municipal Service Taxing Unit (MSTU) Advisory Committee, consisting of 5 Tanglewood Subdivision residents appointed by the Lee County Board of Commissioners, was formed. This Tanglewood MSTU was granted the responsibility of overseeing the care and maintenance of the public lands east and west of the Tanglewood wall, located along McGregor Boulevard, and also of the medians located along the centers of both Tanglewood and Brentwood Parkways.

MSTU committee members serve a three year term. Since its inception, in 1984, the Committee has participated in the drawing up of a yearly budget estimate, and has overseen the maintenance of the public grounds. In 2002 the committee accomplished a major repair to the brick and solar block wall that defines the Tanglewood border along McGregor Boulevard.

This Committee works under the guidance of, and funds are monitored by the Municipal Service Taxing and Benefits Unit Coordinator, Denise Sabatini.

Description of roadways and landscaped areas

There are two entrances that lead from McGregor into the Tanglewood Neighborhood, the Brentwood Parkway Entrance and the Tanglewood Parkway Entrance. Brentwood, the more northerly of the two, is smaller, closer to the highway, and therefore has a smaller area devoted to landscaping. Both of these Parkways have center medians separating the roadway into two lanes. These roadways are Lee County rights of way.

The landscaped public land along the walls at the Tanglewood Parkway entrance is the property of the TRA and not on the Lee County right of way. Also, the land along the north Brentwood entrance wall is owned by the TRA.

Our goal in seeking this Grant

The goal of the MSTU Committee is to maintain these public lands in a condition that is attractive and in harmony with Florida's natural beauty using native plants and as little water for irrigation as possible.

Achieving our goal

In order to achieve the above stated goal of maintaining an attractive appearance we wish to begin work this next year, 2003 - 2004, at both entrances. It is necessary to replace much of the old, overgrown, unattractive and water hungry landscaping that exists along the wall at the entrances, and in the medians adjacent to the two entrances. These medians are in the Lee County highway right-of-way. We would replace old ornamentals with native Florida plants. We would save existing palm, oak, and crape myrtle trees. We would add another oak at the south side of the Tanglewood Entrance to balance the present design.

We have been cautioned by the DOT that the plantings on the median at the Tanglewood Entrance present a visibility problem to both incoming and outgoing traffic. Those plantings have been trimmed to the point of extinction over and over again. The height of the shrubs has prevented "drive throughs", so, in order to maintain the new Florida-friendly plants, we have decided to install traffic type curbing around that median. We will then replant with low orowing vegetation which will allow unobstructed visibility

Lee County Landscaping Funds Program

Irrigation concerns

We retained Youngquist Irrigation to estimate the repair and renovations to the existing irrigation system. The system is old, wasteful of water, and parts of it are non-functioning.

We plan to change from the existing spray system to an irrigation method less wasteful of water. The native plants will require water to establish healthy growth, but after that only low levels of irrigation would be required. This thrifty use of precious water resources will help Southwest Florida preserve its fragile ecosystem.

Youngquist discovered in April of 2004 that the submersible pump at the Brentwood entrance is frozen; it must be pulled and replaced.

3. Public benefits of this proposal

By maintaining their public lands using native plants and an environmentally sound watering system, the Tanglewood MSTU Committee will beautify their community and their part of McGregor Boulevard, minimize the depletion of Florida's precious water, and set an example that we hope others might emulate.

4 & 5. Operation and maintenance covenants, and maintenance budgets

Lee county Ordinance No. 01-23, amending ordinances Nos. 84-9, 85-31, and 00-12;
Ordinance 84-9, as drafted by the Lee County Board of Commissioners and adopted in August 31, 1983, created the Tanglewood Improvement Unit, defined the territory to be included, and established the Board of County Commissioners as the governing body of the unit. The Ordinance provided for the following municipal services within the boundaries of the unit;

- 1. The maintenance of the entrance to and the median strips including mowing, trimming, weeding, planting, fertilizing, and watering; and
- 2. To install or maintain an approved street lighting system.

The Ordinance provides for the appointment, by the Board, of an advisory committee of no more than five persons who reside within the boundaries of the Unit. (The Municipal Service Taxing Unit, or MSTU)

MSTU Members serve for a two year term. Terms are staggered. Vacancies will be filled by an appointment by the Board of Lee County Commissioners.

- 1. A representative of the County Board of Commissioners maintains a roster of the Committee, assists and advises the Committee, and monitors the MSTU's financial resources. The present MSTU Coordinator is Denise Sabatini
- 2. The Committee shall prepare an annual budgetary estimate in accordance with the appropriate rules and regulations of the Board.
- 3. The Tanglewood Improvement Fund is created from a yearly Ad Valorem tax.
- 4. The Committee meets at least two times a year. All meetings are open to the public and are advertised.
- 6. <u>Documentation</u> See the attached copy of the Tanglewood MSTU 2003 2004 budget for documentation of financial support from Ad Valorem taxes.
- 7. <u>Completed Projects</u> For a brief account of other completed projects see page 2, <u>History of the Tanglewood MSTU.</u>

8. Professional Consultants used in preparation of Landscape Design, cost estimates, etc. We have hired an expert in Native Florida Plants to design our project. We consulted four other landscape companies before selecting All Native Garden Center and Plant Nursery. They have the necessary knowledge about, and are a source of many of the wide varieties of plants that

meet our needs. This company also has the aesthetic sensibility to create an attractive display that will be a credit to not only the Tanglewood Community, but also to Lee County. In addition to the Landscape Plan for work to be completed in 2003 - 2004, All Native Garden Center is providing a long range maintenance schedule which will help ensure that the design will be well maintained over a long period of time.

At the request of the Roadway Landscape Advisory Committee, we sought a registered landscape architect to prepare plans for our project based on our original design. After reviewing bids for the job, we hired Greg Diserio, LA, an employee of David M. Jones, Jr. and Associates, Inc, to prepare, sign and seal a landscape project based on the landscape design of John Sibley, owner of All Native Garden Center. Mr. Diserio has also worked with Youngquist Brothers <u>Irrigation</u>, Inc. to prepare our irrigation plans.

Details about irrigation:

In July, 2003, Manny Harris, Youngquist's representative, came to Tanglewood promptly in response to a phone call, and examined the irrigated areas of both entrances and the adjacent medians. He recommended low-to-the-ground mist head sprinklers to replace the old existing 3 to 4 foot tall 360 degree sprinklers. His estimate of July, 2003, states that low mist head sprinklers would be designed to water both planting beds on each side of the Tanglewood and Brentwood entrances plus one island at both entrances, and around the lift station. (However, we do not intend to extend the irrigation out to the lift station.) Hunter mist heads would be used to water these areas. Youngquist will install all new valves, heads, and pipe. The new zones "will be tied into the owner's existing wells." New timers are needed at both entrances. The Youngquist Irrigation Inc. proposal for the sprinkler system stated that the \$4500.00 bid was contingent on the owner being able "to show location of existing sleeves" which carry irrigation lines beneath the roads. The estimate states, "if the sleeves are found and can not be used for the new system then new sleeves will have to be jack and bored" at additional expense.

The <u>Proposal for Directional Drilling</u> stated in their August, 2003, bid is Youngquist's estimate of \$17.00 per foot to cover that eventuality and the possibility that the sleeves might be hard to find.

Youngquist discovered in testing the existing system in mid-April of 2004, that the pump that irrigates the plantings at the Brentwood Parkway entrance is frozen, and should be replaced. To help prevent further problems with the two pumps, one pump at each entrance, installation of a pressure tank at each pump site is recommended.

In April, 2003, Youngquist dug and located the sleeves and pipes that carry the irrigation water under the roadways to the various plantings. In two places there are no sleeves under the roadways. Damage to the road could occur if one of those water-bearing pipes should break.

- 1. There is a one 1" pipe, with no sleeve, carrying water from the south side of the Tanglewood entrance to the first median. They found an adequate four inch sleeve with a 2" water pipe between the median and the north side of Tanglewood Parkway.
- 2. A 3/4" pipe with no sleeve carries irrigation water from the south side of the Brentwood Parkway entrance to the north side.

The solution: Youngquist proposes to bore new 2" sleeves in these locations.

Youngquist reports that the timers at both pumps are malfunctioning and should be replaced. They also recommend adding a second valve creating two zones instead of one on the second island at the Tanglewood entrance (not part of the landscape plan) to adequately water the existing planted area. They also need to cap a broken valve on the third median at that entrance.

Dear Mrs. Richey,

Let me take this opportunity to thank you and the members of the beautification committee for selecting R. S. Walsh Landscaping to re-design the Tanglewood/Brentwood entries and medians. After returning and making a thorough survey of the site I am convinced that much of the problem lies with too much rather than too little landscaping, especially in the medians. I am, therefore, basing our design upon a simplification of each area we discussed.

Much of the plant material I observed appeared to be suffering from lack of proper watering, fertilization and maintenance. There appeared to be (with one or two exceptions) little uniformity. Much of it was much more than necessary. My first recommendation, therefore, in dealing with the medians would be a complete revision of the existing plant material.

Which would include:

Removal of all existing shrubs and ground covers, dirt and rocks, to present a neater, cleaner appearance. Rather than the existing random clusters of sabal palms, I would recommend clustering them, uniformly spaced, with no more than four (4) to a grouping.

Beneath these palms a small grouping of native shrubs. Between the clusters of palms, equally spaced live oak trees, which over a period of years will give a shaded, park like sense when one drives along the street.

Due to the cost of renovation I have broken the work down into the following five phases, each of which will be considered as separate proposals, spaced out at whatever period is most suitable for you.

Phase I - The Tanglewood entrance (not to include the median)

Phase II - Brentwood entrance

Phase III- Cleaning and striping of all medians followed closely by:

Phase IV- Relocation of sabal palms as per plan

Phase V- Installation of sod and oak trees and median shrubs *

As per our discussion, I have used native plants wherever feasible. Also, per our discussion, there will be a charge of \$500.00 for the plans which will be waived in the event you accept the proposal.

LOCATION MAP







