LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA EMERGENCY RESOLUTION NO. 64-09-0| DECLARING A STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the National Hurricane Center has identified a potential flooding danger to coastal residents of Florida from Hurricane Frances, by posting a HURRICANE watch from September 1, 2004 to September 6, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the Governor, by Executive Order Number 04-192, has declared an emergency for the State of Florida due to the imminent landfall from Hurricane Frances, a Category 3/4 Hurricane with anticipated high winds and extensive rainfall; and

WHEREAS, Lee County requires an extensive period of time to evacuate threatened residents from the hazards of flooding from a hurricane; and

WHEREAS, the current error of the National Hurricane Center's meteorological forecast does provide an accurate prediction of where the track of Hurricane Frances will be at that point in time coinciding with Lee County's estimated evacuation times; and

WHEREAS, Hurricane Frances has the potential for causing life threatening conditions and extensive damage to public utilities, public buildings, public communication systems, public streets and roads, public drainage systems, commercial and residential buildings and areas from flooding conditions; and

WHEREAS, §252.38 (3)(2)(5), Florida Statutes, provides authority for political subdivisions, such as Lee County, to declare a State of Local Emergency and to waive the procedures and formalities otherwise required of political subdivisions in order to take whatever actions are necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and


WHEREAS, Lee County Ordinance Number 87-01, states that when a quorum of the board of County Commissioners is unable to meet, the Chairperson of the Board of County Commissioners, or the Vice-Chairperson in his/her absence, or the County Administrator or his/her

designee in the absence of the Chairperson, or Vice-Chairperson is authorized to declare a State of Local Emergency.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

- That Hurricane Frances poses a serious threat to the lives and property of the residents of Lee County as the result of potential extensive flooding, and that a State of Local Emergency shall be declared effective immediately for all unincorporated and incorporated areas within the boundary of Lee County, Florida.
- That the Board of County Commissioners hereby exercises its authority and waives the procedures and formalities required by law for political subdivision, as provided in §252.38 (3)(2)(5), Florida Statutes.
- 3. The duration of this State of Local Emergency is limited to seven (7) days; however, it may be extended, as deemed necessary by the Board of County Commissioners for additional terms in seven (7) day increments.
- 4. The State of Florida Executive Order No. 04-192 relating to Hurricane Frances is hereby incorporated into the terms and conditions of this Resolution.

A RESOLUTION OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, GRANTING EMERGENCY AUTHORIZATION TO THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT ITS DEPARTMENTS, AGENCIES AND INSTRUMENTALITIES TO REMOVE DEBRIS AND WRECKAGE RESULTING FROM HURRICANE CHARLEY FROM BOTH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PROPERTY AND INDEMNIFYING THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FOR SUCH ACTIVITIES IN LEE COUNTY

WHEREAS, on August 13, 2004, Hurricane Charley severely impacted Lee County causing major damage to portions of the County in particular, to its Barrier Islands; and,

WHEREAS, on August 10, 2004, the Governor of the State of Florida by Executive Order Number 04-182, and the Board of County Commissioners by Resolution, declared the existence of a State of Emergency in Lee County on August 11, 2004, and extended such State of Local Emergency on August 17, 24 and 31, 2004 by subsequent Resolutions, all of which are incorporated herein by reference; and,

WHEREAS, in order to prevent the spread of disease, provide secure shelter for victims of the hurricane and otherwise safeguard the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Lee County and the impending approach of a new Hurricane, Frances, the Board finds that there exists a compelling public interest in immediately removing debris and wreckage resulting from Hurricane Charley from both public and private property; and,

WHEREAS, due to the destruction caused by Hurricane Charley many structures have been damaged or destroyed, leaving such structures in uninhabitable condition, and leaving large S:\GS\RESOLUTION\DEBRIS & WRECKAGE REMOVAL - CHARLEY.wpd

quantities of wreckage causing unsafe and unsanitary conditions that endanger persons in the vicinity and the general public; and,

WHEREAS, the presence of large accumulations of wreckage constitutes a public nuisance that renders other structures in the vicinity uninhabitable, and is unsafe for the general public; and,

WHEREAS, on August 13, 2004, the President of the United States has declared Lee County a federal disaster due to Hurricane Charley by Disaster Declaration FEMA-1539-DR; and,

WHEREAS, Congress has authorized and provided means of providing major disaster relief in 42 USC §1570 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 42 USC §5173(a)(1), the President has authority to direct federal departments, agencies and instrumentalities to clear debris and wreckage resulting from a major disaster from publicly and privately-owned lands and waters; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with 42 USC §5173(b), such federal authority cannot be exercised unless the affected state or local government provides formal authorization for such action.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY

COMMISSIONERS OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA that the Board, in light of the existing State

of Local Emergency in Lee County, the approach of Hurricane Frances, and pursuant to its police

powers to protect the public health, safety and welfare, hereby authorizes the United States

Government, its departments, agencies, and instrumentalities to remove debris and wreckage

from both public and private property throughout Lee County resulting from Hurricane Charley.

The County agrees, to the extent permitted by Florida law, to indemnify the Federal Government against any claims resulting from such removal activities of the federal agencies.
