LEE COUNTY RESOLUTION NO.

EXTENDING DECLARATION OF LEE COUNTY AS A MAJOR DISASTER AREA

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners approved Lee County Resolution No. 04-08-70, declaring Lee County as a Major Disaster Area on Tuesday, August 17, 2004, as a result of Hurricane Charley, a Category 4 hurricane, impacting Lee County on Friday, August 13, 2004; and,

WHEREAS, Hurricane Charley caused major damage to residential buildings; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners enacted Lee County Ordinance No. 95-14 to better manage recovery, reconstruction and mitigation activities following a major disaster within the unincorporated areas of Lee County; and,

WHEREAS, the Post-Disaster reconstruction permitting process requires an additional sixty (60) days to ensure the continued expediting of permits for repairs to homes and businesses still recovering from the damage caused by the impact of Hurricane Charley.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA that:

- 1. The above recitals are hereby incorporated by reference.
- 2. Lee County's Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan continues to be activated and serves as the response and recovery structure for County operations.
- 3. The Post-Disaster Recovery Task Force continues to be activated and mobilized pursuant to Lee County Ordinance No. 95-14, having all of the responsibilities

enumerated therein.

- 4. The Post-Disaster Recovery Task Force continues to be activated and mobilized for an additional sixty (60) days, unless the Board of County Commissioners extends the tenure, the Task Force will de-activate after sixty (60) days.
- 5. The Post-Disaster reconstruction permitting process requires the additional sixty (60) days to ensure the continued expediting of permits for repairs to homes and businesses from damage caused by the impact of Hurricane Charley.
