#### 7. BACKGROUND:

The Property Appraiser's Office has requested, as was done in 2003, that the County waive the Annual Agricultural Application Filing once the initial application is made and classification granted. Florida Statutes 193.461 sets forth the process for the filing for Agricultural Exemption. Florida Statutes 193.461(3)(a) provides that the owner of land that was classified agricultural in the previous year and whose ownership or use has not changed, may reapply on a short form as provide by DOR. The County, at the request of the Property Appraiser's Office, by a majority vote may, as it did in 2003, again waive the annual re-application requirement. Representatives of the Property Appraiser's Office will be available to respond to questions.
