1. ACTION REQUESTED/PURPOSE:

Approve and authorize Chairman to execute an interlocal agreement between Lee County and the City of Sanibel for the Lee County Tourist Development Council Beach & Shoreline CIP project, Sanibel Beach Parks Hurricane Charley Expenses. Approve budget transfer of \$400,000 from TDC reserves and amend the FY 2004-05/2008-09 Capital Improvement Program budget accordingly.

9. Background:

On February 4, 2005, the Tourist Development Council (TDC) recommended funding this project from TDC hurricane reserves. These funds are for re-vegetation of the Sanibel beach park facilities following the impacts of Hurricane Charley. The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$850,000, with the City of Sanibel covering the balance.

The attached interlocal agreement authorizes the City of Sanibel to perform the specified work and allows County staff to reimburse the City for expenses incurred. The project is as follows:

AGREEMENT FOR TOURIST DEVELOPMENT TAX FUNDING

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by and between LEE COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the “**COUNTY**” and the City of Sanibel, a municipality incorporated in the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as “**RECIPIENT**”, for funding provided by Lee County pursuant to its Tourist Development Plan.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Florida Statutes §125.0104 and Lee County Ordinance No. 01-16, Lee County collects tourist development tax; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY and **RECIPIENT** acknowledges that the tourist development tax may only be spent in accordance with the Tourist Development Plan adopted by Lee County; and

WHEREAS, the **COUNTY** has approved the **RECIPIENT’S** request for funding under its Tourist Development Tax Plan for implementation of the following project:

NAME: Sanibel Beach Parks Hurricane Charley Expenses –
Revegetation

NUMBER: 201899

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. The **RECIPIENT** will perform the work as outlined in the project description (“Exhibit A”) and submit a detailed invoice to the **COUNTY**. The **COUNTY** will then reimburse the **RECIPIENT** for the amount not to exceed \$400,000.00 during the **COUNTY’S** fiscal year 2005.
2. Funding is solely limited to the project as described in the forms submitted by the **RECIPIENT** to the Tourist Development Council. **RECIPIENT** may not make any major alterations, changes or substitutions to the project description without obtaining prior approval from the Tourist Development Council and **COUNTY**. Minor changes, alterations and/or substitutions may be approved by the Director of the Visitor Convention Bureau or her designee.
3. This Agreement is subject to the **RECIPIENT** complying with the following Special Conditions: N/A
4. **RECIPIENT** shall provide to **COUNTY** evidence of substantial activity within eighteen (18) months at the beginning of the fiscal year.
5. Unspent or unencumbered revenue remaining at the end of the fiscal year may be carried over into the next fiscal year, contingent upon approval of the Board of County Commissioners.
6. Accurate records of all expenditures shall be maintained by the **RECIPIENT**, and these records shall be made available at all reasonable times for inspection, review or audit by the **COUNTY**. Records shall be kept for a period of at least three (3) years following the end of the funding period.

7. **RECIPIENT** will submit quarterly reports to the **COUNTY**. Expenditure reports must be accompanied by sufficient supporting invoices and documentation to support pre-audit and post-audit review. The sufficiency of said documentation shall be determined by the Clerk of the Circuit Court, who may seek additional information as the circumstances require.
8. The **COUNTY** shall not be liable to any person, firm or corporation that contracts with the **RECIPIENT** to provide goods and services associated with the project conducted with the funding. Nor shall the **COUNTY** be liable to any person, firm or corporation for claims against the **RECIPIENT** or debts incurred by the **RECIPIENT**.
9. The **RECIPIENT** shall reimburse the Lee County Tourist Development Tax Trust Fund for any sums adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be an unauthorized expenditure.
10. The **RECIPIENT** covenants to the **COUNTY** that it has lawful authority to enter into this agreement and has authorized the execution of this agreement by its authorized representative.
11. This agreement may not be modified, amended or extended orally. This agreement may be amended only by written agreement executed by the governing bodies of both parties.

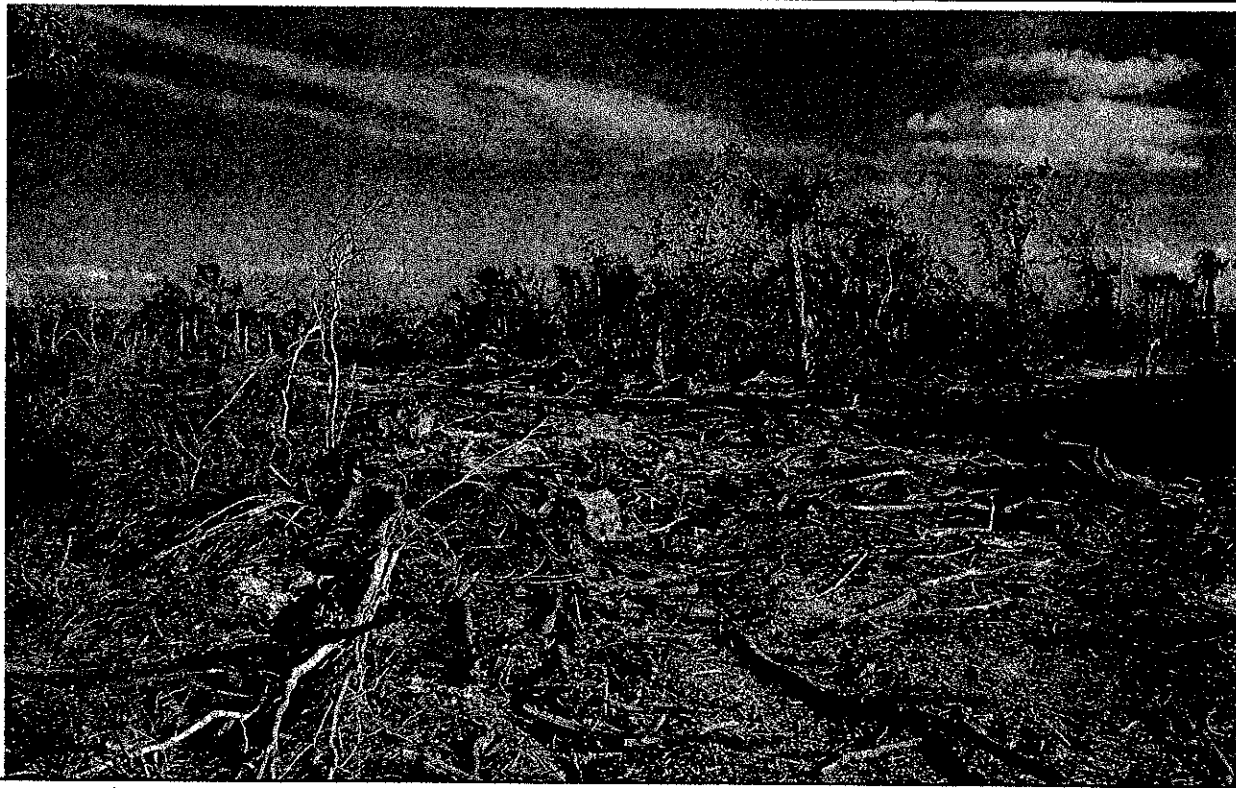

Dear Director Minich:

As you are aware, the City of Sanibel has reopened all public parks and beaches on Sanibel Island. We worked diligently to open the parks as quickly as possible. However, following the removal of the downed vegetation, the parks remain barren and in dire need of vegetation.

Inasmuch as these beaches and the island ecology are a premiere attraction for Lee County's number one industry of tourism, it would be catastrophic to the region's economy to not restore the beach parks as soon as feasible. The City of Sanibel is respectfully requesting the Tourism Development Council to utilize \$400,000 from emergency reserve funds, much of which was generated from the accommodations on Sanibel, to fund a portion of the replanting at the major beach parks.

In consideration of the tourism at risk until these beaches are replanted, we thank you in advance for your favorable review of this very important request. Beach Parks Hurricane Restoration Project

On August 13, 2004 Hurricane Charley knocked down literally thousands of trees on Sanibel Island. The previously lush tropical vegetation at the four major beach parks on the island, Lighthouse, Gulfside, Causeway and Bowman's, was devastated. These parks are among the crown jewels of Lee County tourist destinations and are a major reason visitors travel to Lee County. All of these parks were dominated by Australian pines, which as a whole did very poorly in the storm. Following almost 6 months of debris clean-up at these parks, which is nearly complete, great ugly voids exist in the landscaping, which can be described as barren and straggly at best (see attached photos).

The City has hired R.S. Walsh Landscaping, Inc. to work with both City and County staff in producing detailed re-landscaping plans for all four parks. These plans are now complete and will be presented for review at the February 4 TDC meeting. The plans include palm and attractive shade trees designed to rapidly re-establish the tropical ambiance, shade and beauty at these heavily used parks. The plan emphasizes native tree species that are salt-tolerant and which fared the best in the hurricane. Landscaping will be installed in July-August to take advantage of the rainy season to help plantings become established. Attached is a planting list for each of the four beach parks provided by R.S. Walsh Landscaping, Inc. The estimated cost for restoring the parks is as follows:

Lighthouse Park:	\$220,000
Gulfside (Algiers) City Park:	110,000
Bowman's Beach Park:	400,000
Causeway (City Boat Ramp) Park:	<u>120,000</u>
Total Project Cost:	\$850,000

The City is currently pursuing grants from outside agencies to assist with funding the project. However, even if these grants are received, \$400,000 is required to begin the restoration of the public beaches. We are hereby requesting Tourist Development Council participation in the restoration of the beaches in the amount of \$400,000 from the reserve funds that have been previously put aside for this type of emergency.


Dear D. T.,
