1. ACTION REQUESTED/PURPOSE:

Accept a grant award and sign the forthcoming agreement from the Department of Juvenile Justice to implement the Restitution Accountability Board program for Lee County. Approve a budget amendment resolution in the amount of \$64,137. Establish a full-time grant funded Human Services Coordinator in the Department of Human Services to assist with the administration of the Restitution Accountability Board.

#### 2. WHAT ACTION ACCOMPLISHES:

Enables the Department of Human Services to establish the Restitution Accountability Board Program in Lee County to address juvenile offenders charged with more serious crimes such as grand theft auto and burglary, as well as the victims and the victimization of the neighborhoods. Allows Human Services to hire a full-time grant funded position.

**3. MANAGEMENT RECOMMENDATION**: Accept grant award and approve establishment of the budget and a grant funded position.

9. Background:

Human Services has received five previous grants from the Department of Juvenile Justice to establish Neighborhood Accountability Boards. The Restitution Accountability Board differs from the Neighborhood Accountability Board as the Restitution Board will allow Human Services to address restitution issues with victims and youth under the age of 18 charged with a higher level of crime such as grand theft auto, burglary, felony criminal mischief, or other charges deemed appropriate by the court system.

Restitution Accountability Boards represent a community decision-making process aimed at repairing harm committed against victims and communities. The Board considers input from victims, community members, and offenders who take an active part in the decision-making process to decide what actions the offender must take to make amends. Offenders and victims voluntarily participate in the Restitution Accountability Board program and if the plan is completed the case is diverted from formal action in a traditional court setting process and allows the offender to not have a criminal record if he/she successfully completes the established case plan.

This grant will allow the Human Services Neighborhood Building Program to hire a full-time, grant funded position in order to deliver an enhanced service to the six neighborhood district areas, Cape Coral, Lehigh Acres and a Merchant Board located at the Edison Mall. It will not impact the General Fund in that all funding for this program comes from the Federal grant. The required twenty percent match is met with County general funds currently budgeted in the Neighborhood Building Program.

Funding for the second year will be contingent upon: (1) availability of funds, and (2) a satisfactory program evaluation each year. Your program must help fulfill the goals of the Department's *Delinquency Prevention Plan, Florida's Three Year Comprehensive Plan*, and our mission of reducing juvenile crime.

Your program should actively work to reduce juvenile delinquency for Florida youth. In addition, Restitution Accountability Board must:

- 1) Serve youth between 7 and 17 years of age;
- 2) Direct services to youth with significant family and/or school problems, pre-delinquent behaviors, and/or patterns of substance abuse; and
- 3) Target youth in high risk zip codes.

Accountability is very important to the Department, the Legislature and the public. You will be required to submit monthly budget and activity reports. In addition, your organization will have to submit monthly data on all program youth to the Juvenile Justice Information System. Finally, youth should not commit delinquent offenses while participating in your program nor for at least twelve (12) months after they have completed your program.
