- 1. ACTION REQUESTED/PURPOSE: Authorize a modified method to Lee County Administrative Code 4-4 for the advertising, prequalification, proposals and selection of a general contractor for the construction of the waste to energy expansion project, all as outlined below and described in Attachment A (attached hereto).
- **2. WHAT ACTION ACCOMPLISHES:** Allows the Public Works Department and County Attorney's Office to proceed with the request for proposal (RFP) process to specific pre-qualified contractors.
- 3. MANAGEMENT RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of the requested action.

- **9. Background:** The Solid Waste division has been working closely with Covanta Energy in soliciting interest and determining qualifications of general contractors to perform the construction work for the WTE expansion project. The review and proposal process recommended is as follows:
 - 1. Covanta and Burns and Roe (County's design engineer) solicit interest from companies with demonstrated appropriate experience and that routinely provide this type of work.
 - 2. Interested Contractors fill out a 'prequalification questionnaire'.
 - 3. Companies with appropriate experience and financial and technical qualifications demonstrated by the response to the Pre-Qualification Questionare are invited for a detailed interview. Interview is structured to receive additional information from the companies, allow the companies to ask questions regarding the project, allow the County and Covanta to determine if the companies have complete understanding of the project's construction risks and requirements, and for the companies to indicate that they are seriously planning to propose for the project.
 - 4. The County, Burns and Roe and Covanta will send "Requests for Proposals" to pre-qualified contractors that meet all requirements and have indicated their specific intent to submit a proposal for the project.
 - 5. The County and Covanta will notify all interested contractors of the County's pre-qualified contractors to be provided a 'Request for Proposal'.
 - 6. The County, through Burns & Roe, will receive proposals with the intent to award a contract to the lowest overall proposer meeting all contract requirements, which in the County's opinion meets the County's interests for the Project.

LEE COUNTY WTE EXPANSION PROJECT

PROCUREMENT METHOD FOR CONSTRUCTION SERVICES GENERAL CONTRACTOR SCOPE OF WORK

• General Contractor Scope

The General Contractor will provide services for the 3rd unit construction and integration. Included in the construction scope are site preparation, demolition required for building additions, excavation, pilings, foundations, building structures, equipment erection, electrical equipment installation, SNCR installation, electrical equipment and cable, instrumentation and cable, HVAC equipment and power/process piping.

Scope of services for the General Contractor will not include installation of the stoker, steam generator, air pollution control equipment, cooling tower structure/equipment and field fabricated tanks. Separate contracts are being entered into with other specialty contractors with proven industry expertise for supply and installation.

Mobilization of the General Contractor is scheduled for December 2005. The General Contractor's Scope of work is in the order of approx. \$25 million and will require a performance and payment bond in the amount of the contract price. Mechanical Completion of all construction activities is currently scheduled for the first quarter of 2007.

Advertising

Covanta Lee, Inc., acting on behalf of Lee County, has contacted numerous qualified contractors that have expressed interest in proposing on the General Contractor Scope associated with the Lee County Facility Expansion Project. To date, fifteen (15) contractors expressed interest in participating in the evaluation process. Eight (8) of the interested contractors recently were prequalified to participate in a similar Covanta project and afterwards expressed written interest to be considered for proposing on the Lee County Expansion. The balance of interested contractors became aware of the project through other business sources (e.g. Burns & Roe) and inquiries. All fifteen contractors are well established and recognized in the energy and electric utility construction market. The list of contractors contacted or showing interest is attached as "Exhibit 1".

Contractor Qualification Assessment

In order to establish the financial and technical qualifications of the interested General Contractor, each contractor was requested to respond to a Pre-Qualification Questionnaire. Each of the contractors was requested to provide a wide range of company background information including, but not limited to, organizational structure, financial ratings/strength, bonding

capacity, annual revenue, ENR ranking, market focus, related energy experience, recent Florida experience and safety performance (reference attached "Exhibit 2" titled "Pre-qualification Questionnaire"). In addition, the County and Covanta have itemized a "List of Prospective General Contractors" summarizing each contractor's information for quick reference. All contractors, except Teton Industries and Matrix Services, provided pre-qualification information to Covanta, Burns & Roe and Lee County.

• Invitation for Interview

After evaluating all contractor qualification information provided, Covanta issued an "Invitation for Contractor Interview Meeting" to eleven (11) of the fifteen (15) contractors deemed to be qualified. The invitation outlined a meeting agenda and included a draft version of a typical Covanta Construction Contract for review and comment by contractor during the interview meeting. A copy of the invitation is attached as "Exhibit 3".

The purpose for conducting an interview meeting prior to the pre-proposal meeting was to further evaluate each contractor's qualifications, assess contractor's willingness to accept design quantity risk if necessary, determine willingness to comply with contractual terms and discuss limitation of liability. After discussing project details, Convanta asked each contractor to confirm a commitment to complete the proposal process if selected.

Covanta will provide its listing of most qualified contractors and recommends that the number of contractors allowed to receive a "Request for Proposal" (RFP) package be limited to four to six contractors. The reason for limiting the number of proposers is based on Covanta's past experience. Experience has shown that more qualified contractors may drop out of the competitive process if numerous or significantly less qualified contractors are allowed to participate. Due to the limited number of suggested contractors, Covanta has attempted via the interview process to identify any contractors that may drop out early in the process and avoid impacts that could occur if a contractor(s) drops out after the RFP is issued, thus further decreasing the limited number of contractors for consideration.

Contractors Excluded from Initial Invitation to Submit a Proposal

During the time frame between receiving the contractor's qualification packages and issuance of invitation for interview, two contractors (SNC-Llavalin and Matrix Services) declined to proceed with the interview process due to their current business environment. Furthermore, Convanta has not confirmed an interview meeting to date with one additional contractor, Irwin Industries. Covanta has delayed scheduling a meeting with Irwin Industries due to concerns of experience and bonding. Further evaluation of Irwin Industries is pending by Covanta.

• Response to Interview Invitation

As mentioned above, invitations were forwarded to eleven (11) qualified contractors. Interview meetings have already been completed with six (6) contractors, including Dick Corp., CCC Universal Constructors, BE&K Inc., Lockwood Greene E&C, Casey Industrial, and Sauer, Inc. All of the above contractors have proven to be highly qualified and will be considered for participation in the proposal process.

From a legal standpoint, Sauer Inc., CCC Universal and Lockwood Greene have represented that no legal issues are pending or in progress. BE&K Inc. provided information stating that their company and/or subsidiaries, incident to their business activities, have a number of legal proceedings in various stages of development. BE&K further represents that the majority of these proceedings involve matters as to which liability, if any, of BE&K or its subsidiaries, would be adequately covered by insurance.

Non-Response

Responses to the invitation were not received from Teton Industrial Group and Kvaerner Industrial Constructors. Kvaener was recently short listed on another Covanta project, but has taken numerous commercial exceptions that have yet to be resolved. Kvaerner represented in their pre-qualification package no legal issues are pending or in progress. No legal status information was provided by Teton since the Pre-qualification Questionnaire was not returned.

Due to lack of response to the pre-qualification and/or interview invitation, no further consideration was given to these two contractors as potential proposers.

• Notice to Decline

Notices to "decline the pre-proposal interview process" were received from the following contractors: The Industrial Company, Whiting-Turner Contracting Company, S&B Engineers & Constructors and Fru-Con Construction Corp. Contractors advised that they were too busy to participate in the interview / RFP process, except for The Industrial Company (TIC). TIC explained that if a 90% design package was provided and quantity risk minimized, they would be interested in submitting a proposal for the project. Neither Covanta nor the County anticipates that a 90% design package will be available.

From a legal standpoint, all contractors above have experienced some type of legal action during the course of business, but represent pending or in progress legal actions are not rare for the amount of contracts executed and any outstanding claims would not adversely affect their respective company's financial strength.

• Notice of Pre-Qualified Contractors

Upon approval by the Board of County Commissioners of this Contractor pre-qualification / RFP process, staff will notify all interested contractors of the County's designated list of pre-qualified contractors.

Additional updates will be provided as the RFP / selection process continues to evolve.

Covanta Energy and our client, Lee County, FL, have begun to conduct interviews with contractors that have expressed interest and submitted "Pre Qualification Questionnaires" for bidding the "General Contractor Scope" at the Lee County Waste-to-Energy Expansion Project The project expansion will increase the existing facility's process capacity by approximately onethird or 636 TPD. In attendance from Covanta Energy will be the Project Manager (Peter Young), Construction Manager (Jack Holmes) and Facility Manager (Jody Howard). In attendance representing the Lee County Solid Waste Division will be Lindsey Sampson.
