AN ORDINANCE AMENDING LEE COUNTY ORDINANCE NOS. 88-11 AND 96-24; RELATING TO THE COMMERCIAL USE OF RIGHTS-OF-WAY; AMENDING SECTION 3 OF THE LEE COUNTY COMMERCIAL USE OF RIGHTS-OF-WAY ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO CHARITABLE SOLICITATION OF FUNDS; AMENDING SECTION 5 OF LEE COUNTY ORDINANCE 92-29, BY INCORPORATING AN **EXEMPTION FOR ORGANIZED CHARITIES TO OBTAIN** PERMITS SOLICIT TO FOR CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS WITHIN COUNTY RIGHTS-OF-WAY PROVIDED SUCH CHARITABLE SOLICITATIONS ARE CONDUCTED BY SWORN AND/OR CERTIFIED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS OF FIREFIGHTERS: PROVIDING FOR INTENT, SEVERABILITY, CONFLICT, PENALTY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners desire to regulate the commercial use of the rights-of-way of all roads, streets and highways under its protection of public safety; and

WHEREAS, Lee County Ordinance 88-11, the Lee County Commercial Use of Rights-of-Way Ordinance, was amended by Lee County Ordinances 92-29 and 96-24; and

WHEREAS, permit exceptions allowing the solicitation of funds in County rights-ofway for limited purposes serves a public purpose while protecting the public's health, safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

SECTION ONE: The intent of this Ordinance is to amend Lee County Ordinance No. 88-11, as further amended by Lee County Ordinances No. 92-29 and 96-24, by authorizing the issuance of permits for charitable organizations soliciting in County rights-

of-way, provided such charitable solicitations are conducted by sworn and/or certified law

enforcement officers/firefighters.

SECTION TWO: The Lee County Commercial Use of Rights-of-Way Ordinance,

Ordinance No. 88-11, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows with underlined

language being an addition to the previously adopted text and deleted and/or repealed

language being shown by struck-through type.

SECTION THREE: Section Four of Lee County Ordinance No. 88-11, as

amended, is further amended as follows:

COMMERCIAL USE OF RIGHTS-OF-WAY

It is unlawful to make any commercial use of the rights-of-way of any road, street, or highway within the County road system of Lee County. County-owned roads lying within the municipal boundaries of the City of Sanibel shall not be subject to the provisions of this Ordinance but shall be regulated by that municipality. Prohibited commercial use shall include but

is not limited to:

E. The solicitation of funds or donations for charitable, educational, religious or political

purposes; and

SECTION FOUR: Section Five of Lee County Ordinance No. 88-11, as amended,

is hereby further amended by amending Section Five (A) as follows:

EXCEPTIONS:

The Commercial Use of the Rights-of-Way of any road, street or highway within the County road system is expressly prohibited, except that the Commercial Use as listed below may occur in the public rights-of-way,

but only in compliance with the requirements and conditions set forth herein.

Α. County Permitted or Sponsored Special Events.

DRAFT FOR DISCUSSION PURPOSES ONLY LEE COUNTY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE July 13, 2005

Any portions of a road, street, or highway, including the rights-of-way, within the County road system may be used for an art festival, parade, fair, or other similar special event which is either properly permitted by the County pursuant to Administrative Code AC-8-1, as may be amended, or under control of the County as a County sponsored function. The special events exception is not intended to apply to events for which the primary purpose is: solicitation of funds; or, solicitation for sale of goods, property, or services for charitable, educational, religious or political purposes. However, such activities may be permitted if they are clearly adjuncts of a properly permitted special event.

SECTION FIVE: Section Five of Lee County Ordinance No. 88-11, as amended, is hereby further amended by amending Section Five (G) as follows:

G. <u>Annual Charitable Solicitation Drives conducted by sworn and/or certified law</u> enforcement officers or firefighters.

Organized charities may apply for a permit to solicit charitable contributions within the County Rights-of-Way provided such charitable solicitations are conducted by sworn and/or certified law enforcement officers or firefighters, and meet all of the permit requirements of Administrative Code AC 8-1 and any other supplemental Administrative Code provisions hereinafter adopted.

SECTION SIX: PENALTY

Any person who violates this ordinance shall be prosecuted in the same manner as misdemeanors are prosecuted. Upon conviction, a violator shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500 or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed 60 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. This enforcement procedure and penalty for violations of this

ordinance is adopted under the express authority of §125.69(1), Florida Statutes.

SECTION SEVEN: SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable and it is the legislative intention to

confer upon the whole or any part of the ordinance the powers herein provided for. If any

of the provisions of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional by any court of competent

jurisdiction, the decision of such court shall not affect or impair any remaining provisions

of the ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this ordinance would

have been adopted had such unconstitutional provision not been included herein.

SECTION EIGHT: CONFLICTS OF LAW

Whenever the requirements or provisions of this ordinance are in conflict with the

requirements or provisions of any other lawfully adopted Lee County ordinance or Florida

Statute, the more restrictive will apply.

SECTION NINE: CODIFICATION, INCLUSION IN CODE AND

SCRIVENER'S ERRORS

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this

ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Lee County Code; and that sections of

this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and that the word "ordinance" may be

changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to

accomplish such intention; and regardless of whether such inclusion in the code is

accomplished, sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and

typographical errors which do not affect the intent may be authorized by the County

Administrator, or his designee, without need of public hearing, by filing a corrected or

recodified copy of same with the Clerk of Circuit Court.

SECTION TEN: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon receipt of official acknowledgment from the Secretary of State of Florida that it has been duly filed with that office.
