9. Background:

On January 28, 2003, the Board adopted a resolution designating the Midpoint Memorial Bridge and Veteran's Memorial Parkway as a limited access facility in accordance with Florida Statutes, Chapter 338 (Resolution No. 03-01-37). The resolution has been amended once since then to add a new access point east of Del Prado Parkway.

Recently, the City Council of the City of Cape Coral, Florida, has approved the realignment of SW 2nd Court in Cape Coral in connection with the development approval granted for Lowe's Home Centers, Inc. (Cape Coral Ordinance 37-06, Section III.m.) A condition of the development approval requires Lowe's Home Centers, Inc., to vacate the existing SW 2nd Court and realign its connection with the Veteran's Memorial Parkway approximately 131 feet to the west. The relocation will increase the separation between intersections on Veteran's Memorial Parkway. The relocation of the access point will improve traffic circulation and will not present a threat to the public's health, safety, and welfare. The cost of the work associated with the relocation of the access point will be borne by Lowe's Home Centers, Inc.

A resolution has been prepared for the Board's consideration in connection with this request. Staff recommends that the Board reaffirm the designation of the road corridor as a limited access facility and all previous amendments. Staff further recommends the approval of the proposed amendment relocating the access as it conforms with the standard set forth in Lee County Administrative Code 11-10 and the spirit of Lee County Resolution 03-01-37.

LEE COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 06- -

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 03-01-37, WHICH DESIGNATED THE MIDPOINT MEMORIAL BRIDGE AND VETERAN'S MEMORIAL PARKWAY AS A LIMITED ACCESS FACILITY IN ACCORDANCE WITH FLORIDA STATUTES, CHAPTER 338, AND ESTABLISHED PERMANENT ACCESS POINTS.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) is considered the transportation authority in Lee County by virtue of the authority granted in Florida Statutes, Section 125.01(m), to provide and regulate roads; and,

WHEREAS, the Board, as transportation authority, has the power to establish, designate, and regulate limited access facilities in accordance with Florida Statutes, Section 338.01; and,

WHEREAS, the Board designated and established the Veteran's Parkway Corridor from the Caloosahatchee River to Pine Island Road as a limited access facility with fixed access points in accordance with Florida Statutes, Section 338.01, pursuant to Resolution No. 03-01-37; and,

WHEREAS, the Board designated the roadway as a limited access facility in order to allow for the safe and relatively unimpeded movement of large volumes of traffic; and,

WHEREAS, at the request of the City Council of the City of Cape Coral, Florida (the "Cape"), the Board added a new access point to Veteran's Memorial Parkway east of Del Prado Boulevard at SE 26th Street within the City of Cape Coral (Resolution No. 03-09-95); and,

WHEREAS, Lee County Administrative Code 11-10 sets forth the technical requirements for relocating designated access points on controlled access roadways and its criteria is used to determine whether the public interest would be served by altering the access plan on limited access facilities; and,

WHEREAS, the Cape recently approved the realignment of SW 2nd Court by Lowe's Home Centers, Inc., in connection with Cape Coral Ordinance No. 37-06, Section III.m.;

and,

WHEREAS, the road realignment necessitates the relocation of the access point for SW 2nd. Court to the west of its current location; and,

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the relocation of the access point for SW 2nd Court will preserve safety and traffic capacity and is, therefore, in the best interest of the public; and.

WHEREAS, the Board desires to reaffirm the designation of Veteran's Memorial Parkway as a limited access facility, all previous amendments as well as the relocation of the access point for SW 2nd Court.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS that:

- 1. The designation of the Veteran's Memorial Parkway corridor from the Caloosahatchee River to Pine Island Road as a limited access facility with fixed access points in accordance with Section 338.01, F.S. is hereby affirmed including the access point added east of Del Prado Boulevard at SE 26th Street within the City of Cape Coral. (Map attached as Exhibit 1.)
- 2. The access to SW 2nd Court is hereby relocated approximately 131± feet to the west of its current location, from Highway Station 891+58.26 to Highway Station 890+27, as reflected in Exhibits 1 and 2 attached hereto.
- 3. The relocation of the SW 2nd Court access does not present a threat to public health, safety, and welfare. The relocation will serve the public interest because it will improve traffic circulation.
- 4. The design attached as Exhibit 1 supercedes all prior depictions of the limited access facility.
- This resolution was adopted by an affirmative vote of a super majority of the Board of County Commissioners.
