## The Board of County Commissioners RESOLUTION

Whereas: Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis or ALS is better known as Lou Gehrig's disease; and

Whereas: ALS is a fatal neurodegenerative disease characterized by degeneration of cell bodies of the

lower motor neurons in the gray matter of the anterior horns of the spinal cord; and

Whereas: The initial symptom of ALS is weakness of the skeletal muscles, especially those of the

extremities; and

Whereas: As ALS progresses the patient experiences difficulty in swallowing, talking, and breathing;

and

Whereas: ALS eventually causes muscles to atrophy and the patient becomes a functional

quadriplegic; and

Whereas: ALS does not affect a patient's mental capacity, so that the patient remains alert and aware

of his or her loss of motor functions and the inevitable outcome of continued deterioration

and death; and

Whereas: ALS occurs in adulthood, most commonly between the ages of 40 to 70 years, with the peak

age about 55 years, and affects men two to three times more often than women; and

Whereas: Over 5,000 new ALS patients are diagnosed annually; and

Whereas: On average, patients diagnosed with ALS only survive two to five years from the time of

diagnosis; and

Whereas: Research indicates that military veterans are at a 50% or greater risk of developing ALS

than those who have not served in the military; and

Whereas: ALS has no known cause, means of prevention, or cure; and

Whereas: Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis Awareness Month increases the public's awareness of ALS

patients' circumstances and acknowledges the terrible impact this disease has not only on the patient but on his or her family as well, and recognizes the research being done to

eradicate this horrible disease.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Board of County Commissioners of Lee County, Florida that we do hereby proclaim May 2007 as:

## **Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis Awareness Month**

in Lee County and be it further Resolved, that the Board of County Commissioners of Lee County strongly urges the President and Congress of the United States to enact legislation to provide additional funding for research in order to find a treatment and eventually a cure for amyotrophic lateral sclerosis.
