Bard Express, version 3.0.0.7, is available for Windows-based computers and is a handy tool to search for titles and download the files for audio or e-braille material. With this update, you can listen to your audiobooks using the BARD Express Player on your computer!

My Talking Books on Smart Speaker

My Talking Books is an Amazon Alexa skill that can be used to access and stream audiobooks from BARD on Echo devices or through the Alexa app on a smartphone. It is currently in Open Beta status, meaning the software is available to only 5000 users who will provide feedback for improvements before its official release. Using the skill's voice-only interface, you can search the BARD catalog, manage your wish lists, book lists, preference settings, reading speed, review your streaming history and so much more. Recommendations – Adult Reading Festival Authors

Gus Murphy series by Reed Farrel Coleman – DB087384

A gritty, atmospheric series about the other side of Long Island, far from the wealth of the Hamptons, where real people live - and die. Includes *Where it Hurts* (2016) and *What You Break* (2017). Coleman also writes for Robert B. Parker's *Jesse Stone* series.

Close Knit by Jenny Colgan – DB124753

Follow Gertie MacIntyre from knitting circle to air stewardess in this glorious and romantic summer novel set in Scotland's windswept Northern isles. 2024.

Don't Know Tough by Eli Cranor - DB119399

Friday Night Lights gone dark with Southern Gothic; Eli Cranor delivers a powerful noir that will appeal to fans of Wiley Cash and Megan Abbott. 2022.

The Collective by Alison Gaylin – DB105827

This novel asks how far a grieving mother will go to right a tragic wrong in this propulsive novel of psychological suspense. 2021. Gaylin also writes for Robert B. Parker's *Sunny Randall* series.

Every Note Played by Lisa Genova – DB091562

A powerful exploration of regret, forgiveness, freedom and what it means to be alive. Concert pianist Richard received standing ovations around the world. Now diagnosed with ALS, he faces the loss of motor control and his musical career. 2018.

Not In Love by Ali Hazelwood – DB122038

A forbidden, secret affair proves that all's fair in love and science. Torn between loyalty and an undeniable attraction, Rue and Eli throw caution out the lab and the boardroom windows. 2024.

August Snow by Stephen Mack Jones – DB087398

Tough, smart, and struggling to stay alive, August Snow is the embodiment of Detroit. Growing up in the city's Mexicantown, August joined the police force only to be drummed out by a conspiracy of corrupt cops and politicians. He has just returned to the house he grew up in after a year away, and quickly learns he has many scores to settle. 2017.

The Leftover Woman by Jean Kwok – DB124822

Kwok writes an evocative family drama and a riveting mystery about the ferocious pull of motherhood for two very different women. 2023

Ms. Demeanor by Elinor Lipman – DB112174

Jane Morgan is a valued member of her law firm—or was, until a prudish neighbor, binoculars poised, observes her having sex on the roof of her NYC apartment building. As she tries to adapt to life within her apartment walls, she discovers she hasn't heard the end of her tattletale neighbor. 2022.

Bombshell: A Hell's Belles Novel by Sarah MacLean – DB104924

After years of living as London's brightest scandal, Lady Sesily Talbot has embraced the reputation and the freedom that comes with the title. No one looks twice when she lures a gentleman into the dark gardens beyond a Mayfair ballroom...and no one realizes those trysts are not what they seem. 2021.

Must Love Flowers by Debbie Macomber – DB115385

Two women at different stages of life find themselves on a journey of renewal after undergoing hardships in this uplifting novel. As Maggie and Joan confront difficult life choices, they draw strength from their new friendship in surprising ways. 2023.

Famous in a Small Town by Viola Shipman – DB119247

A magical tale of destiny and small-town charm based in Good Hart, Michigan. Mary runs the Very Cherry General Store and has been waiting for the arrival of a stranger she's believed since childhood would carry on her legacy. Along comes Becky Thatcher. 2023.

Not another love song by Julie Soto – DB122925

Gwen Jackson is a self-taught professional violinist. Xander Thorne is the exact opposite - a rock star cellist with a bad attitude. When Gwen is offered first chair of the orchestra, she can't help but notice a hostile sense of competition between them...but also an electric chemistry. 2024.

The Mango Tree: a Memoir of Fruit, Florida, and Felony by Annabelle Tometich – DB120533

A memoir of growing up as a mixed-race Filipina "nobody" in suburban Florida. Annabelle traces her upbringing while reckoning with her father's death in a Fort Myers motel, her fiery mother's yearning for the country she left behind, and her own journey in the pursuit of belonging. 2024.

Recommendations – Teen Reading Festival Authors

Dungeons and Drama by Kristy Boyce – DB118520

A fun YA romcom full of fake dating hijinks! Musical lover Riley aspires to become a director on Broadway. Crucial to this plan is to bring back her school's spring musical, but Riley is grounded and stuck working at her dad's game shop. 2024.

One of Us is Lying by Karen M. McManus – DB088357

Five students walk into detention, and only four walk out. According to investigators, the last student's death wasn't an accident. He was planning to post juicy reveals about all four of his classmates the next day, which makes them each suspects. Or are they the perfect patsies for a killer who's still on the loose? 2017.

Cape: The League of Secret Heroes by Kate Hannigan – DB096628

Soon after being recruited by the mysterious Mrs. Boudica to join a secret military intelligence operation, Josie, Mae and Akiko discover their superhero abilities and use them against a Nazi operation.. For grades 4-7. 2019.

Chirp by Kate Messner – DB098678

After moving to Vermont, a young gymnast hides a secret as she makes new friends and investigates her grandmother's claim that someone is trying to destroy her cricket farm. For grades 4-7. 2020.
