Approve First Contract Amendment to Renew EMS Patient Care Software

#### MOTION REQUESTED 1.

A) Approve Amendment No. 1 to the contract with ESO Solutions, Inc., PB200100ANB to utilize pricing on the Marion County EMS Patient Care Software 18P-140 CNT with ESO Solutions, Inc., for the purchase of EMS patient care software, on an as needed basis, through the contract renewal expiration date of September 17, 2024, and any renewals or extensions approved by Marion County, as approved in the departments' annual adopted budgets.

B) Authorize the County Manager or designee to execute the amendment on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners

#### **ITEM SUMMARY** II.

Approves a contract amendment with ESO Solutions, Inc., to use pricing on the Marion County EMS Patient Care Software contract. This software is used for patient care reporting. The original term of the contract was for 3 years, 6 months and 14 days with any renewals or extensions approved by Marion County in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.00. Expenditures in future years are not expected to exceed \$140,00.00 annually. This approves the contract renewal through September 17, 2024.

### BACKGROUND AND IMPLICATIONS OF ACTION III.

A) Board Action and Other History

> Lee County Emergency Medical Services uses ESO Solutions, Inc. software for patient care reporting. This platform operates on iPad devices for field reporting and has integrations to facilitate EMS billing and communication with local hospitals. This includes a Health Data Exchange (HDE) connection with Lee Health, which allows for pre-hospital documentation to enter the hospital's system and for patient information to return to the EMS software.

Marion County solicited a Request for Proposal RFP18P-140 that went through the competitive procurement process and negotiations for EMS Patient Software. The software will provide a Patient care reporting system. Computer Aided Dispatching integration, cardiac monitor integration, electronic interfaces, and Health Data Exchange integration. A market analysis was completed, and the piggyback purchase is being used because the software must run on existing hardware to avoid an additional expense to purchase new hardware. This limits the number of vendors eligible for this type of solution. This system is also the same system being implemented at Lee Health, which will enable the exchange of patient care data between the entities in real time.
